- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to prohibiting entry onto private land without permission.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 Law enforcement entry onto private land without permission prohibited Exception.
- 7 <u>1. As used in this section, "law enforcement officer" has the meaning provided in section</u> 8 <u>12.1-01-04.</u>
- Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to subsection 3, a law
 enforcement officer may not search buildings or private land unless the law
 enforcement officer receives permission from the landowner or a lessee of the land.
- 12 <u>3. A law enforcement officer may enter private land without permission if:</u>
- a. Probable cause exists that a violation of law has occurred, is occurring, or is
 about to occur;
- b. A search warrant has been issued; or
- 16 <u>c.</u> Responding to an emergency situation, accident, or other threat to public safety.
- 17 <u>4. Any property or contraband seized by a law enforcement officer in violation of</u>
- 18 <u>subsection 2 may not be used as evidence against a defendant in any criminal</u>
- 19 <u>proceeding.</u>
