- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the practice of natural hair braiding and threading.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **43-11-01**. **Definitions**.

- 7 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 8 1. "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.
- 9 2. "Booth space" means that part of a licensed salon that is operated independently by
 10 an individual licensed under this chapter.
- "Cosmetologist" means an individual licensed under this chapter to practice
 cosmetology.
- 4. "Cosmetology" means any one or a combination of practices generally and usually
 performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or
 cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person holding out as practicing
 cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this chapter and in
 and upon whatever place or premises; and in particular cosmetology.
- 18 <u>a.</u> <u>The term</u> includes the following or any one or a combination of <u>these</u> practices:
 19 arranging, dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching,
 20 coloring, or similar work, upon the hair of any <u>personindividual</u> by any means or
- 21 with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the use of
- 22 cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise, 23 massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, performing

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1		noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body, manipulation			
2		of eyelashes, or manicuring the nails of any personindividual.			
3		b. The term does not include natural hair braiding or threading.			
4	5.	"Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a			
5		cosmetologist is practiced.			
6	6.	"Esthetician" means a person<u>an individual</u> who is licensed by the board to engage in			
7		the practice of skin care.			
8	7.	"Homebound" means any personan individual who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable			
9		to travel to a salon.			
10	8.	"Instructor" means any person of the age of eighteen years or morean individual who			
11		is at least eighteen years old, who is a licensed cosmetologist, who teaches			
12		cosmetology or any practices taught in a duly registered school of cosmetology, and			
13		who has met the requirements of section 43-11-27 and has applied for and received			
14		an instructor's license.			
15	9.	"Invasive care" means any procedure that invades the live tissue of the dermis,			
16		including:			
17		a. Laser use; and			
18		b. Chemical peels using:			
19		(1) Thirty percent or higher concentration of alpha hydroxy acid;			
20		(2) Twenty percent or higher concentration of beta hydroxy acid;			
21		(3) Two percent or higher concentration of resorcinol;			
22		(4) Fifteen percent or higher concentration of trichloroacetic acid (TCA); or			
23		(5) Fifteen percent or higher concentration of phenol.			
24	10.	"Manicuring" means the cleansing, cutting, shaping, beautifying, or massaging of the			
25		hands, feet, or nails of any person<u>individual</u>.			
26	11.	"Manicurist" means a personan individual who is licensed by the board to engage in			
27		the practice of manicuring.			
28	12.	"Master cosmetologist" means any personan individual who has met the requirements			
29		of section 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managing cosmetologist			
30		license.

1	13.	"Mechanical device" means a clip, comb, crochet hook, curler, curling iron, hairpin,					
2		rolle	roller, scissors, blunt-tipped needle, thread, and hair binder.				
3	<u>14.</u>	<u>"Nat</u>	"Natural hair braiding" means the service of twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending,				
4		locki	locking, or braiding hair by hand or with a mechanical device. Natural hair braiding is				
5		<u>com</u>	mon	ly known as "African-style hair braiding" but is not limited to any particular			
6		<u>cultu</u>	cultural, ethnic, racial, or religious forms of hairstyles.				
7		a. The term includes:					
8			(1)	The use of natural or synthetic hair extensions, natural or synthetic hair and			
9				fibers, and decorative beads and other hair accessories;			
10			<u>(2)</u>	Minor trimming of natural hair or hair extensions incidental to twisting,			
11				wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding hair;			
12			<u>(3)</u>	The making of wigs from natural hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers, and			
13				hair extensions; and			
14			<u>(4)</u>	The use of topical agents, such as conditioners, gels, moisturizers, oils,			
15				pomades, and shampoos, in conjunction with performing services under			
16				paragraph 1 or 2.			
17		b. The term does not include:					
18			<u>(1)</u>	The application of dyes, reactive chemicals, or other preparations to alter			
19				the color of the hair or to straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair; or			
20			<u>(2)</u>	The use of chemical hair joining agents, such as synthetic tape, keratin			
21				bonds, or fusion bonds.			
22	<u>15.</u>	"School of cosmetology" means an establishment operated for the purpose of teaching					
23		cosmetology.					
24	14.<u>16.</u>	"Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions,					
25		creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, performing					
26		noni	noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body of any person. The				
27		term does not include invasive care or threading.					
28	15.<u>17.</u>	"Student" means any person who is engaged in the learning or acquiring of any or all					
29		the practices of cosmetology and while so learning, performs or assists in any of the					
30		practices of cosmetology in any school registered or licensed and under the immediate					
31		supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this chapter.

- <u>16.18.</u> "Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in teacher's
 training in a duly registered school of cosmetology.
- 3 <u>17.19.</u> "Threading" means the method of removing hair from the eyebrows, upper lip, or other
 4 body part by using cotton thread to pull hair from follicles.
- 5a.The term may include the use of an over-the-counter astringent, gel, and powder,6tweezers, and scissors, incidental to the removal of hair by threading.
- 7 b. The term does not include the use of chemicals, heat, or any type of wax.
- 8 <u>20.</u> "Tuition" means the total cost of a person's cosmetology studies, and does not include
 9 books or demonstration kits.
