- 2 Century Code, relating to a teacher shortage loan forgiveness program administered by the
- 3 superintendent of public instruction; to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-04 of the North

4 Dakota Century Code, relating to the duties of the superintendent of public instruction; to repeal

- 5 section 15-10-38 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a teacher shortage loan
- 6 forgiveness program administered by the state board of higher education; to provide for a

7 transfer; to provide an exemption; to provide an effective date; and to provide an expiration

8 date.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 12 **15.1-02-04**. Superintendent of public instruction Duties.
- 13 The superintendent of public instruction:
- Shall supervise the provision of elementary and secondary education to the students
  of this state.
- Shall supervise the establishment and maintenance of schools and provide advice and
  counsel regarding the welfare of the schools.
- 18 3. Shall supervise the development of course content standards.
- 19 4. Shall supervise the assessment of students.
- 5. Shall serve as an ex officio member of the board of university and school lands.
- 21 6. Shall keep a complete record of all official acts and appeals.
- 22 7. As appropriate, shall determine the outcome of appeals regarding education matters.
- 8. Shall direct school district annexation, reorganization, and dissolution and employ and
  compensate personnel necessary to enable the state board of public school education

26	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
27	and enacted as follows:				
28	<u>Loans - Teacher shortages - Loan forgiveness.</u>				
29	<u>1.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall administer a student loan forgiveness			
30		program for individuals teaching at grade levels, in content areas, and in geographical			
31		locations identified as having a teacher shortage or critical need. The superintendent

1		<u>may</u>	approve loan forgiveness for no more than two teachers per year in a school	
2		<u>distr</u>	ict. The superintendent shall adopt rules to implement the program.	
3	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	superintendent annually shall identify grade levels, content areas, and	
4		geo	graphical locations in which a teacher shortage or critical need exists.	
5	<u>3.</u>	<u>To b</u>	e eligible for loan forgiveness under this section, an individual:	
6		<u>a.</u>	Must have graduated from an accredited teacher preparation program and	
7			signed a contract to teach at a grade level or in a content area and in a	
8			geographical location identified by the superintendent of public instruction as	
9			having an existing teacher shortage or critical need; and	
10		<u>b.</u>	Must have an existing student loan.	
11	<u>4.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this section, the definitions of rural school district and remote town	
12		<u>scho</u>	ool district have the same meaning as the definitions under the national center for	
13		<u>edu</u>	cation statistics locale codes.	
14	<u>5.</u>	<u>lf an</u>	n individual is receiving loan forgiveness under any other provision, the individual	
15		<u>may</u>	not receive loan forgiveness under this section during the same application year.	
16	<u>6.</u>	Subject to appropriation, an eligible individual may receive loan forgiveness under the		
17		prog	gram as follows:	
18		<u>a.</u>	If the individual accepts one of up to five positions of critical need in a nonrural	
19			school district or nonremote town school district, the individual may receive up to	
20			three thousand dollars per year for a maximum of four consecutive years.	
21		<u>b.</u>	If the individual accepts a position in a rural school district or remote town school	
22			district with an enrollment of fewer than one thousand students, the individual	
23			may receive up to four thousand five hundred dollars per year for a maximum of	
24			four consecutive years.	
25		<u>C.</u>	If the individual accepts one of up to five positions of critical need in a rural	
26			school district or remote town school district with an enrollment of fewer than one	
27			thousand students, the individual may receive up to six thousand five hundred	
28			dollars per year for a maximum of four consecutive years.	
29	<u>7.</u>	<u>The</u>	superintendent shall consider all applications under this section based on the	
30		<u>num</u>	ber of unfilled school vacancies, prioritized by critical need and geographic	
31		<u>loca</u>	tion.

1	<u>8.</u>	Upon notification the individual has completed a full year of teaching in a school			
2		district, state-supported school, or nonpublic school in this state at a grade level or in a			
3		content area and in a geographical location identified by the superintendent as one in			
4		which a teacher shortage or critical need exists, the superintendent shall distribute			
5		funds directly to the lending institution of the individual to repay outstanding loan			
6		principal balances on behalf of eligible applicants. The superintendent shall terminate			
7		loan forgiveness payments to eligible individuals if the loan principal balance of the			
8		eligible individual is paid in full.			
9	<u>9.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall administer the program only for eligible			
10		individuals receiving teacher loan forgiveness benefits for the 2018-19 school year.			
11		The superintendent of public instruction shall provide benefits under this program to			
12		eligible individuals until the individual has received the maximum benefit under this			
13		section or has become ineligible to receive benefits under the program.			
14	SECTION 4. REPEAL. Section 15-10-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.				
15	SECTION 5. TRANSFER. The commissioner of higher education shall transfer the funding				
16	continued into the 2019-21 biennium to the superintendent of public instruction to defray the				
17	expenses of the teacher loan forgiveness program.				
18	SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - TEACHER LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM FUNDING.				
19	Pursuant to provisions of section 54-44.1-11 the unexpended amount remaining from the				
20	appropriation for the teacher loan forgiveness program, as authorized in section 1 of chapter 28				
21	of the 2017 Session Laws, at the end of the 2017-19 biennium, may be continued into the				
22	2019-21 biennium for the purpose of providing teacher loan forgiveness.				
23	SEC	CTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 2 of this Act becomes effective July 1, 2023.			
24	SEC	CTION 8. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 3 of this Act is effective through June 30, 2022,			
25	and afte	r that date is ineffective.
