- 1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress and the President of the United States to protect
- 2 American consumers by advancing a coordinated effort to address, promote, and provide an
- 3 effective and innovative solution to combat illegal, unsolicited, and unwanted robocalls and "call
- 4 spoofing".
- 5 WHEREAS, a robocall is an automated telephone call delivering a recorded message, often
- 6 on behalf of a telemarketing company or as part of a fraudulent scheme; and
- 7 WHEREAS, an estimated 98 million robocalls are received daily in the United States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission receives approximately 200,000
- 9 complaints each year regarding robocalls; and

10 WHEREAS, in 2017, the Federal Trade Commission received 4.5 million complaints about

11 unwanted calls; and

WHEREAS, according to the Federal Trade Commission, fraud from illegal, unsolicited, and
unwanted calls amounts to approximately \$9.5 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, small businesses in the United States waste an estimated 20 million hours per
 year dealing with illegal, unsolicited, and unwanted robocalls, translating to at least \$475 million

16 in lost productivity annually; and

17 WHEREAS, robocalls have been combined with a process called "call spoofing" in which a

18 call appears to originate from a local, often legitimate, number to trick the call recipient into

19 answering the call; and

20 **WHEREAS**, under the federal Truth in Caller ID Act, individuals are prohibited from

21 transmitting misleading or inaccurate caller ID information with the intent to defraud, cause

22 harm, or wrongly obtain anything of value; and

23 WHEREAS, as technology continues to evolve the number of robocalls and "call spoofing"

24 continues to grow and although the Federal Communications Commission has initiated new

25 policy initiatives to combat illegal robocalls and "call spoofing", more needs to be done;

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## 1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

## 2 NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

3 That the Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly urges Congress and the President of the United 4 States to protect American consumers by advancing a coordinated effort among the Federal 5 Trade Commission, the Federal Communications Commission, and the Federal Bureau of 6 Investigation to effectively address, promote, and provide an effective and innovative solution 7 to combat illegal, unsolicited, and unwanted robocalls and "call spoofing"; and 8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly urges Congress to 9 grant additional authority to the Federal Communications Commission to allow the agency to 10 stop unwanted robocalls and "call spoofing"; and 11 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Federal Communications Commission is urged to 12 educate the public on how to report illegal telephone calls; and 13 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution 14 to the President of the United States, the Majority and Minority Leaders of the United States 15 Senate and the United States House of Representatives, each member of the Federal Trade 16 Commission, the Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, the Director of the 17 Federal Bureau of Investigation, and each member of the North Dakota Congressional

18 Delegation.
