1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsection 8 of section 43-41-11 and three new sections

2 to chapter 43-41 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensing of social workers;

3 to amend and reenact sections 43-41-01, subsection 2 of section 43-41-02, subsection 1 of

4 section 43-41-03, and sections 43-41-04, 43-41-05, 43-41-08, 43-41-10, and 43-41-12, of the

5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensing of social workers; and to provide an

6 effective date.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 43-41-01. Definitions. 11 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires: 12 1. "Board" means the North Dakota board of social work examiners. 13 2. "College or university" means an institution of higher education whose social work-14 program has been accredited by an accrediting body approved by the board. 15 "Licensed certified social worker" means an individual who has a doctorate or master's 3. 16 degree in social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the 17 requirements for licensure. 18 4. "Licensed independent clinical social worker" means an individual who has a doctorate 19 or master's degree in social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the 20 requirements for licensure or has been registered by the board for third-party-21 reimbursement before August 1, 1997. 22 "Licensed social worker" means an individual who has a baccalaureate degree in-5. 23 social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the requirements for 24 licensure.

1		"Client" means the individual, couple, family, group, organization, or community that
2		seeks or receives social work services from an individual licensed social worker or an
3		organization, regardless of whether the licensed social worker or organization bills or
4		accepts or requests the payment of fees for the services.
5	<u>3.</u>	"Clinical supervision for licensure" means an interactional professional relationship
6		between a clinical supervisor which meets the standards adopted by the board and a
7		social worker and which provides evaluation and direction over the supervisee's
8		practice of clinical social work in preparation for the social worker's licensure as a
9		licensed clinical social worker, in accordance with the requirements adopted by the
10		board, and promotes development of the social worker's knowledge, skills, and
11		abilities to engage in the practice of clinical social work in an ethical and competent
12		manner.
13	<u>4.</u>	"Consultation" means an advisory professional relationship between a social worker
14		and an individual with particular expertise, with the social worker legally and ethically
15		maintaining responsibility for all judgments and decisions regarding service to the
16		<u>client.</u>
17	<u>5.</u>	"Counseling" means a method used by a social worker to assist an individual, couple,
18		family, or group in learning how to solve problems and make decisions about personal,
19		health, social, educational, vocational, financial, and other interpersonal concerns.
20	<u>6.</u>	"Electronic social work services" means the use of a computer, including the internet,
21		social media, online chat, text, and electronic mail, or other electronic means, such as
22		a wireless communications device, landline telephone, or video technology, to provide
23		information to the public, deliver social work services to a client, communicate with a
24		client, manage confidential information and case records, store and access
25		information about clients, and arrange payment for professional services.
26	<u>7.</u>	"Licensed baccalaureate social worker" means an individual licensed under this
27		chapter to practice baccalaureate social work.
28	<u>8.</u>	"Licensed clinical social worker" means an individual licensed under this chapter to
29		practice clinical social work.
30	<u>9.</u>	"Licensed master social worker" means an individual licensed under this chapter to
31		practice masters social work.

1	6.<u>10.</u>	"Pri	vate practice of social work" means the independent practice of social work by a
2		qua	lified individuallicensee who is practicing within that licensee's scope of practice,
3		anc	who is self-employed on a full-time or part-time basis and is responsible for that
4		inde	ependent practice. Consultation services provided to an organization or an agency
5		are	not considered to be the private practice of social work.
6	7.<u>11.</u>	"So	cial work practice" consists of the professional application of social work values,
7		prin	ciples, and techniques in helping people obtain tangible services; counseling;
8		psy	chotherapy with individuals, families, and groups; helping communities or groups to-
9		imp	rove social and health services; providing social casework; directly supervising
10		pro	grams providing social work services; social work education; social work research;
11		or a	any combination of these. The practice of social work requires knowledge of human
12		dev	relopment and behavior, of social, economic, and cultural institutions, and the
13		inte	eraction of all these factorsmeans the application of social work theory, knowledge,
14		me	thods, ethics, and the professional use of self to restore or enhance social,
15		psy	chosocial, or biopsychosocial functioning of individuals, couples, families, groups,
16		org	anizations, and communities. The scope of practice for licensees of the board
17		<u>con</u>	isist of the following:
18		<u>a.</u>	The practice of baccalaureate social work, which includes the application of
19			social work theory, knowledge, methods, ethics, and the professional use of self
20			to restore or enhance social, psychosocial, or biopsychosocial functioning of
21			individuals, couples, families, groups, organizations, and communities.
22			Baccalaureate social work is generalist practice that includes assessment,
23			planning, implementation, intervention, evaluation, research, social work case
24			management, information and referral, counseling, supervision, consultation,
25			education, advocacy, community organization, and the development,
26			implementation, and administration of policies, programs, and activities.
27		<u>b.</u>	The practice of masters social work, which includes, in addition to the practice of
28			baccalaureate social work, the application of specialized knowledge and
29			advanced practice skills in the areas of assessment, treatment planning,
30			implementation, intervention, evaluation, social work case management
31			information and referral, counseling, supervision, consultation, education,

1			research, advocacy, community organization, and the development,
2			implementation, and administration of policies, programs, and activities. Under
3			the supervision of a licensed clinical social worker, the practice of masters social
4			work may include the practices reserved to licensed clinical social workers.
5		<u>C.</u>	The practice of clinical social work, which includes, in addition to the practice of
6			baccalaureate social work and the practice of masters social work, the
7			application of specialized clinical knowledge and advanced clinical skills in the
8			areas of assessment, treatment planning, implementation and evaluation, social
9			work case management information and referral, counseling, supervision,
10			consultation, education, research, advocacy, community organization, the
11			development, implementation, intervention, and administration of policies,
12			programs, and activities, and the diagnosis and treatment of mental, emotional,
13			and behavioral disorders, conditions, and addictions. Treatment methods include
14			the provision of individual, marital, couple, family, and group counseling and
15			psychotherapy. The practice of clinical social work may include the provision of
16			clinical supervision.
17	<u>12.</u>	<u>"Psy</u>	ychotherapy" means the use of treatment methods utilizing a specialized, formal
18		inte	raction between a licensed clinical social worker and an individual, couple, family,
19		<u>or g</u>	roup in which a therapeutic relationship is established, maintained, and sustained
20		<u>to u</u>	nderstand unconscious processes; intrapersonal, interpersonal, and psychosocial
21		<u>dyn</u>	amics; and the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of mental, emotional, and
22		<u>beh</u>	avioral disorders, conditions, or addictions.

24		mor	nitor services by a licensed social worker from a variety of resources on behalf of

2		and records, including client records, and copy, photograph, or take samples. The
3		board may require a licensed social worker to give statements under oath and. The
4		board may require a licensed social worker to submit to a physical, chemical, or
5		mental examination, or both, by a physician or physicians andor other qualified
6		evaluation professionals selected by the board if it appears to be in the best interests
7		of the public that an evaluation examination be secured. The board may require a
8		licensee to enroll in a treatment or monitoring program approved by the board if the
9		board determines in good faith to do so would be beneficial to the licensee or protect
10		the public. Failure to satisfactorily undergo an examination or enroll in a treatment and
11		monitoring program must be reported to the board by the treating professional.
12		Treating professionals are immune from any liability for reporting made in good faith. A
13		licensee is deemed to consent to the treating professional of the approved evaluation,
14		or the approved treatment and monitoring program, reporting to the board on the
15		results of the examination or the progress of the treatment or monitoring program, at
16		such intervals the board deems necessary. The approved examination, or treatment or
17		monitoring program, may release examination information, or treatment or monitoring
18		information, to the board so the board may evaluate the results of the examination or
19		the licensee's progress in and the effectiveness of the treatment or monitoring
20		program. A written request from the board constitutes authorization to release
21		information. Absent a client release on file allowing the release of information, all client
22		records released to the board are confidential and are not public records.

24		hearing, client and juvenile records introduced or client and juvenile testimony of a

11			the district court of Burleigh County. This right of enforcement is in addition to any
12			other rights the board may have as to any person directed to pay costs. In any
13			action for recovery of costs, proof of the board's decision is conclusive proof of
14			the validity of the order of payment and the terms for payment.

The practice of social work by a practitioner in this jurisdiction through electronic social 13 work services or other means, regardless of the location of the client, constitutes the 14 practice of social work and is subject to this chapter. 15 3. A social worker providing electronic social work services shall take all necessary 16 measures to ensure compliance with relevant practice standards as established by the 17 board. 18 SECTION 11. A new section to chapter 43-41 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 19 and enacted as follows: 20 Permission to report - Immunity. 21 An individual who has knowledge of conduct by an applicant or a licensee which may 22 constitute grounds for disciplinary action under this chapter or the rules of the board or of any 23 unlicensed practice under this chapter may report the violation to the board. An individual is 24 immune from civil liability or criminal prosecution for submitting in good faith a report under this 25 chapter or for otherwise reporting, providing information, or testifying about violations or alleged 26 violations of this chapter. 27 SECTION 12. A new section to chapter 43-41 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 28 and enacted as follows: 29 **Duty to report - Immunity.** 30 A licensed social worker who has substantial evidence a licensee has an active addictive 31 disease for which the licensee is not receiving treatment under a program approved by the

- 1 board under an agreement entered under this section, is diverting a controlled substance, or is
- 2 mentally or physically incompetent to carry out the duties of the license, shall report the
- 3 evidence to the board. An individual who reports under this section in good faith and without
- 4 <u>malice is immune from any civil or criminal liability arising from the report. Failure to provide a</u>
- 5 report within a reasonable time may be considered grounds for disciplinary action against the
- 6 licensee.
- 7 SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on February 1, 2020.
