## FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

HCR 3015: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying best practices to reduce offender recidivism, increase educational opportunities, prepare incarcerated offenders to rejoin their communities, establish and implement a community transitional housing program, including independent host homes, and encourage communities to reintegrate previously incarcerated individuals into society.

**HCR 3031:** A concurrent resolution requesting the Legislative Management to study the juvenile justice process, levels of collaboration among various service systems, implementation of dispositional alternatives, and methods for improving outcomes for juveniles involved in the process.

**HCR 3055:** A concurrent resolution to amend and reenact section 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to the transfer of earnings of the legacy fund. Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.
