- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact five new sections to chapter 15.1-27 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to school district transportation aid payments; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 15.1-31-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the transportation of open
- 4 enrollment students.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:

3		to be made to the school districts for the transportation of students and shall pay the	
4		amount certified to each school district. Payments must be made in the same manner	
5		and at the time provided for other state payments in section 15.1-27-01.	
6	<u>2.</u>	A school district may not receive more than ninety percent of the actual costs incurred	
7		for the transportation of students.	
8	<u>3.</u>	For purposes of this section, actual costs include the transportation operating	
9		expenditures reported to the superintendent of public instruction for the most recent	
10		year plus the eight-year average cost of transportation equipment determined by the	
11		superintendent of public instruction. Any district having contracted for transportation	
12		services may determine the actual costs for the first year the district provides its own	
13		transportation services by using the statewide average cost of transportation during	
14		the first year.	
15	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-31-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
16	amended and reenacted as follows:		
17	15.1-31-05. Open enrollment - Transportation.		
18	A school district of residence may provide transportation to a student participating in open		
19	enrollment. If a district of residence does not provide transportation to a student participating in		
20	open enrollment, transportation may be provided by the admitting district. A school district may		
21	not receive transportation aid disbursements under subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 1 of		
22	this Act or subsection 3 of section 1 of this Act for transporting students who are participating in		
23	open enrollment, or who are enrolled pursuant to a written contract entered by the sending and		
24	admitting districts which waives the charge and collection of tuition for the student.
