A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the parks and recreation department; to provide for a transfer; to amend and reenact section 10 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws, relating to International Peace Garden capital projects; to repeal section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws, relating to International Peace Garden capital projects; to provide for an exemption; to provide a report; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the parks and recreation department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the parks and recreation department and the Lewis and Clark interpretive center and for providing a grant to the International Peace Garden, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

1	SECTION 7. INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND		
2	IMPROVEMENTS FUND. The International Peace Garden line item in subdivision 2 of section		
3	of this Act includes the sum of \$3,000,000, from the strategic investment and improvements		
4	fund for International Peace Garden capital projects or the repayment of any outstanding loan		
5	from the Bank of North Dakota authorized in section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session		
6	Laws, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023.		
7	Expenditure of the funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to the province of Manitoba		
8	providing funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with the funding		
9	referenced in this section.		
10	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 10 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is		
11	amended and reenacted as follows:		
12	SECTION 10. REQUIREMENTS - MATCHING FUNDS - INTERNATIONAL		
13	PEACE GARDEN CAPITAL PROJECTS. The International Peace Garden line item in		
14	subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,000,000 for capital projects.		
15	Expenditure of thesethe funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to one-to-one-		
16	matching funds being raised from nonstate sourcesthe province of Manitoba providing		
17	funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with funding		
18	referenced in this section. The parks and recreation department shall review and		
19	accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing funds to projects		
20	and shall assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section.		
21	The International Peace Garden shall report quarterly to the parks and recreation		
22	department regarding the expenditure of these funds along with the the source of the		
23	matching funds. The funds appropriated in this section are not subject to section		
24	54-44.1-11, and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and		
25	ending June 30, 2023, for capital projects.		
26	SECTION 9. REPEAL. Section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is repealed.		
27	SECTION 10. EXEMPTION - INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN - REQUIREMENTS.		
28	Any funds remaining in the International Peace Garden line item for repair of the peace tower in		
29	section 30 of chapter 15 of the 2013 Session Laws are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and		

any unexpended funds are available for capital projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. Funding available for use by the International Peace Garden

in this section is subject to the International Peace Garden raising one-to-one matching funds from nonstate sources of North Dakota sources consistent with the 2013 North Dakota legislative language. The parks and recreation department shall review and accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing additional funds to the project and shall assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section. **SECTION 11. EXEMPTION - PARK ENHANCEMENTS.** Any funds remaining for park enhancements in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 53 of the 2015 Session Laws are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds are available for park enhancement projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. SECTION 12. EXEMPTION - EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS. Of the funds appropriated in the parks operation and maintenance line item for extraordinary repairs, \$675,000 in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2017 Sessions Laws is not subject to section 54-44.111, and any unexpended funds are available for extraordinary repairs during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. SECTION 13. EMERGENCY. The \$3,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund appropriated for the International Peace Garden in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act and sections 7, 8, and 9 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
