A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the parks and
recreation department; to provide for a transfer; to amend and reenact section 10 of chapter 44
of the 2019 Session Laws, relating to International Peace Garden capital projects; to repeal
section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws, relating to International Peace Garden
capital projects; to provide for the conveyance of real property; to provide for a legislative
management study; to provide an application; to provide for an exemption; to provide for a
report; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the parks and recreation department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the parks and recreation department and the Lewis and Clark interpretive center and for providing a grant to the International Peace Garden, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

11 The 2021-23 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget 12 for the 2023-25 biennium. The parks and recreation department shall report to the

appropriations committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time
funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION - REPORTING. In addition to the amounts appropriated in section 1 of this Act, any additional income from federal or other funds that become available are appropriated to the parks and recreation department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. The department shall report any additional income under this section to the office of management and budget and the legislative council. SECTION 4. GAME AND FISH OPERATING FUND - TRANSFER - BOAT RAMP

21 **OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.** The sum of \$122,000, or so much of the sum as may be

22 necessary, included in the park operations and maintenance line item in subdivision 1 of

23 section 1 of this Act, is from the game and fish operating fund, or federal or other funds

24 available to the game and fish department, and must be transferred to the parks and recreation

25 department as requested by the director of the parks and recreation department for

26 maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repairs expenses relating to boat ramps at state

27 parks for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

28 SECTION 5. CONVEYANCE OF LAND AND BUILDINGS - LEWIS AND CLARK

29 **INTERPRETIVE CENTER - APPLICATION.** The State of North Dakota, by and through the

30 parks and recreation department, shall convey ownership of the Lewis and Clark interpretive

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1 center and surrounding real property to the state historical society. Sections 54-01-05.2 and

2 54-01-05.5 do not apply to this conveyance.

3 SECTION 6. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND 4 **IMPROVEMENTS FUND.** The park operations and maintenance line item in subdivision 1 of 5 section 1 of this Act includes \$7,500,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund 6 for deferred maintenance for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. 7 SECTION 7. PARKS MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND 8 **IMPROVEMENTS FUND.** The recreation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act 9 includes \$1,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for a matching grant 10 program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. The parks and 11 recreation department may spend these funds for capital project improvements at state parks. 12 subject to the department obtaining matching funds from nonstate sources for each project on a 13 dollar-for-dollar basis. 14 SECTION 8. INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND 15 **IMPROVEMENTS FUND.** The International Peace Garden line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$3,000,000, from the strategic investment and improvements 16 17 fund for International Peace Garden capital projects or the repayment of any outstanding loan 18 from the Bank of North Dakota authorized in section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session 19 Laws, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023.

20 Expenditure of the funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to the province of Manitoba

providing funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with the fundingreferenced in this section.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 10 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

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SECTION 10. REQUIREMENTS - MATCHING FUNDS - INTERNATIONAL

PEACE GARDEN CAPITAL PROJECTS. The International Peace Garden line item in
 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,000,000 for capital projects.

- 28 Expenditure of these the funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to one-to-one-
- 29 matching funds being raised from nonstate sourcesthe province of Manitoba providing
- 30 <u>funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with funding</u>
- 31 referenced in this section. The parks and recreation department shall review and

1 accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing funds to projects 2 and shall assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section. 3 The International Peace Garden shall report guarterly to the parks and recreation 4 department regarding the expenditure of these funds along with the the source of the 5 matching funds. The funds appropriated in this section are not subject to section 6 54-44.1-11, and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and 7 ending June 30, 2023, for capital projects. 8 SECTION 10. REPEAL. Section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is repealed. 9 SECTION 11. EXEMPTION - INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN - REQUIREMENTS. 10 Any funds remaining in the International Peace Garden line item for repair of the peace tower in 11 section 30 of chapter 15 of the 2013 Session Laws are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and 12 any unexpended funds are available for capital projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 13 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. Funding available for use by the International Peace Garden 14 in this section is subject to the International Peace Garden raising one-to-one matching funds 15 from nonstate sources of North Dakota sources consistent with the 2013 North Dakota 16 legislative language. The parks and recreation department shall review and accept engineering 17 proposals and specifications before committing additional funds to the project and shall assist 18 with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section. 19 SECTION 12. EXEMPTION - PARK ENHANCEMENTS. Any funds remaining for park 20 enhancements in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 53 of the 2015 Session Laws are not 21 subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds are available for park enhancement 22 projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. 23 SECTION 13. EXEMPTION - EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS. Of the funds appropriated in 24 the parks operation and maintenance line item for extraordinary repairs, \$675,000 in 25 subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2017 Sessions Laws is not subject to section 26 54-44.111, and any unexpended funds are available for extraordinary repairs during the 27 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. 28 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - PARKS MATCHING GRANT 29 **PROGRAM.** During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the 30 effectiveness of the parks matching grant program created in section 7 of this Act and the

31 feasibility and desirability of creating a parks and recreation foundation. The legislative

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- 1 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 2 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.
- 3 SECTION 15. EMERGENCY. The \$3,000,000 from the strategic investment and
- 4 improvements fund appropriated for the International Peace Garden in subdivision 2 of
- 5 section 1 of this Act and sections 8, 9, and 10 of this Act are declared to be an emergency
- 6 measure.
