BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

18	for the 2023-25 biennium. The state department of health shall report to the appropriations					
19	committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the					
20	biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.					
21	SECTION 3. COVID-19 BORROWING AUTHORITY - APPROPRIATION. The state					
22	department of health, subject to the approval of the emergency commission, may borrow up to					
23	\$25,000,000 from the Bank of North Dakota for the purposes of responding to the COVID-19					
24	public health emergency. Any moneys borrowed from the Bank of North Dakota pursuant to this					
25	section are appropriated and may be spent by the state department of health for testing, contact					
26	tracing, and other costs related to responding and mitigating the COVID-19 public health					
27	emergency for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. If the state					
28	department of health does not have sufficient funds to repay the Bank of North Dakota, the					
29	department shall request a deficiency appropriation from the sixty-eighth legislative assembly					
30	sufficient for repayment of the amount borrowed plus interest. The funding in this section is					
31	considered one-time funding.					

1 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - INSURANCE TAX DISTRIBUTION FUND. The 2 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$1,125,000 from the 3 insurance tax distribution fund for rural emergency medical services grants. 4 SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - COMMUNITY HEALTH TRUST FUND. The estimated 5 income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$18,337,620 from the community 6 health trust fund for the following programs: 7 \$200,000 Behavioral risk factor survey 8 234,500 Behavioral health loan repayment 9 Domestic violence prevention 300,000 10 Women's way 329,500 11 Dentists' loan repayment 360,000 12 Local public health state aid 525,000 13 580,324 Cancer programs 14 4,515,296 Local public health pandemic response grants 15 Tobacco prevention and control 5,043,000 16 Tobacco prevention and control grants to local public health units 6,250,000 17 Total community health trust fund \$18,337,620 18 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 amended and reenacted as follows: 20 23-01-02. Health council - Members, terms of office, vacancies, compensation, 21 officers, meetings. 22 The health council consists of nine members appointed by the governor including four 23 persons from the health care field, and five persons representing consumer interests. The 24 governor may select members to the council from recommendations submitted by trade, 25 professional, and consumer organizations. On the expiration of the term of any member, the 26 governor, in the manner provided by this section, shall appoint for a term of three years, 27 persons to take the place of members whose terms on the council are about to expire. The 28 officers of the council must be elected annually. Any state agency may serve in an advisory 29 capacity to the health council at the discretion of the council. The council shall meet at least 30 twice each year and at other times as the council or its chairman may direct. The health council 31 shall have as standing committees any committees the council may find necessary. The

- 1 chairman of the council shall select the members of these committees. The members of the 2 council are entitled to receive sixty-two dollars and fifty cents as compensation per dayat the 3 rate set for a member of the legislative assembly under subsection 1 of section 54-03-20 and 4 their necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09 5 while attending council meetings or in the performance of any special duties as the council may 6 direct. The per diem and expenses must be audited and paid in the manner in which the 7 expenses of state officers are audited and paid. The compensation provided for in this section 8 may not be paid to any member of the council who received salary or other compensation as a 9 regular employee of the state, or any of its political subdivisions, or any institution or industry 10 operated by the state. 11 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - STATE DEPARTMENT OF 12 **HEALTH.** During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the 13 roles of the state health officer, health council, medical advisory board, and governor as they
 - **HEALTH.** During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the roles of the state health officer, health council, medical advisory board, and governor as they relate to the administration of the state department of health. The study must include consideration of the role of the health council if the governor seeks to terminate the appointment of the state health officer or to adjust the salary of or take punitive action against the state health officer. Additionally, the study must include whether the orders of the state health officer regarding public health directives have primacy over orders issued by the governor. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.
