- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 43-11-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to certification of niche beauty services providers; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 43-11-01 and 43-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to exemptions to regulation
- 4 by the state board of cosmetology and definitions relating to the regulation of cosmetology.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **43-11-01. Definitions.**

- 9 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 10 1. "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.
- 11 2. "Booth space" means that part of a licensed salon operated independently by an12 individual licensed under this chapter.
- 13 3. <u>"Cosmetic application" means the application of a cosmetic to enhance the</u>
- 14 <u>appearance of the face or skin, including powder, foundation, rouge, eyeshadow,</u>
- 15 eyeliner, mascara, and lipstick. The term includes the application of makeup applied
- using an airbrush. The term does not include the application of permanent makeup or
 tattooing.
- 18 <u>4.</u> "Cosmetologist" means an individual licensed under this chapter to practice
 19 cosmetology.
- 4.5. "Cosmetology" means any one or a combination of practices generally and usually
 performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or
 cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person holding out as practicing
 cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this chapter and in
- 24 and upon whatever place or premises.

1		a. The term includes the following or any one or a combination of these practices:		
2		arranging, dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching,		
3		coloring, or similar work, upon the hair of any individual by any means or with		
4		hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the use of		
5		cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise,		
6		massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, performing		
7		noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body, manipulation		
8		of eyelashes, or manicuring the nails of any individual.		
9		b. The term does not include natural hair braiding or threading.		
10	5.<u>6.</u>	"Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a		
11		cosmetologist is practiced.		
12	6.<u>7.</u>	"Esthetician" means an individual who is licensed by the board to engage in the		
13	1	practice of skin care.		
14	7.<u>8.</u>	"Eyelash extension application" means the application, removal, and trimming of		
15		threadlike natural or synthetic fibers to an eyelash and includes the cleansing of the		
16		eye area and lashes. Eyelash extensions do not include color agents, straightening		
17		agents, permanent wave solutions, bleaching agents, or any other cosmetology		
18		service.		
19	<u> <u> </u></u>	-"Hairstyling" means the practice of shampooing, conditioning, drying, arranging,		
20		curling, straightening, or styling hair using only mechanical devices, hair sprays, and		
21		topical agents, such as balms, oils, and serums. The term includes the use and styling		
22		of hair extensions, hair pieces, and wigs. The term does not include cutting hair or the		
23		application of dyes, bleach, reactive chemicals, keratin treatments, or other		
24	I	preparations to color or alter the structure of hair.		
25	<u> 10.9.</u>	"Homebound" means an individual who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel to		
26	I	a salon.		
27	8.<u>11.</u>10.	"Instructor" means an individual who is at least eighteen years old, who is a licensed		
28		cosmetologist, who teaches cosmetology or any practices taught in a duly registered		
29		school of cosmetology, and who has met the requirements of section 43-11-27 and		
30		has applied for and received an instructor's license.

17	iron, flat iron, hairpin, roller, scissors, blunt-tipped needle, thread, tweezers, and hair

24			(1)	The use of natural or synthetic hair extensions, natural or synthetic hair and		
25				fibers, and decorative beads and other hair accessories;

27				wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding hair;		
28			(3)	The making of wigs from natural hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers, and		
29				hair extensions; and		

1	(4) The use of topical agents, such as conditioners, gels, moisturizers, oils,				
2		pomades, and shampoos, in conjunction with performing services under				
3		paragraph 1 or 2.				
4	b. Ti	ne term does not include:				
5	(1) The application of dyes, reactive chemicals, or other preparations to alter				
6		the color of the hair or to straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair; or				
7	(2) The use of chemical hair joining agents, such as synthetic tape, keratin				
8		bonds, or fusion bonds.

10	teachir	g cosmetology.				
11	16.<u>19.</u>18.	"Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions,				
12	creams	, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, performing				
13	noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body of any person. The					
14	term do	pes not include invasive care or threading.				
15	17.<u>20.</u>19.	"Student" means any person who is engaged in the learning or acquiring of any				
16	or all th	e practices of cosmetology and while so learning, performs or assists in any of				
17	the pra	ctices of cosmetology in any school registered or licensed and under the				
18	immed	ate supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this chapter.				
19	18.<u>21.</u>20.	"Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in				
20	teache	r's training in a duly registered school of cosmetology.				
21	19.<u>22.</u>21.	"Threading" means the method of removing hair from the eyebrows, upper lip,				
22	or othe	r body part by using cotton thread to pull hair from follicles.				
23	a. Ti	ne term may include the use of an over-the-counter astringent, gel, and powder,				
24	tv	eezers, and scissors, incidental to the removal of hair by threading.				
25	b. TI	ne term does not include the use of chemicals, heat, or any type of wax.				
26	20.<u>23.</u>22.	"Tuition" means the total cost of a person's cosmetology studies, and does not				
27	include	books or demonstration kits.				
28	SECTION 2	AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
29	amended and reenacted as follows:					
30	43-11-02. Ex	cemptions from provisions of chapter.				
31	This chapter does not apply to:					

1	1.	Services in case of emergency.			
2	2.	Services provided by persons practicing cosmetology upon members of their			
3		immediate families.			
4	3.	Services by a person licensed by the state and working within the standards and			
5		ethics of that person's profession, if that person does not represent to the public that			
6		the person is a cosmetologist or manicurist.			
7	4.	Services by nurses, undertakers, and morticians lawfully engaged in the performance			
8		of the usual and ordinary duties of their vocation.			
9	5.	Educational activities conducted in connection with any regularly scheduled meeting or			
10		any educational activities of any bona fide association of licensed cosmetologists, from			
11		which the general public is excluded. For purposes of this subsection a "bona fide			
12		association of cosmetologists" means any organization whose constitution, bylaws, or			
13		membership rules establish within said organization a class of membership consisting			
14		of licensed cosmetologists.			
15	6.	Services provided by retailers or their sales personnel trained in the demonstration of			
16		cosmetics application, beauty aid, or equipment, if the cosmetics are applied only with			
17		disposable applicators that are discarded after each customer demonstration. The-			
18		board may adopt rules to ensure sanitary conditions for services provided under this			
19		exemption.			
20	7.	Services provided in a licensed hospital or a nursing home by a person practicing			
21		cosmetology on a volunteer basis without compensation or by a nurse's assistant.			
22	8.	Skin care provided under the supervision, control, and responsibility of a physician			
23		practicing within the scope of the physician's license under chapter 43-17 or nurse			
24		practicing within the scope of the nurse's license under chapter 43-12.1.			
25	<u>9.</u>	Providing dry hairstyling.			
26	<u>10.</u>	Providing eyelash extension application.			
27	SECTION 3. Section 43-11-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted				
28	as follow	/S:			
29	<u>43-1</u>	1-02.1. Certification for niche beauty services.			
30	The	board shall certify an individual who performs only hairstyling and cosmetic application			
31	<u>as a nich</u>	as a niche beauty services provider. The board may require a certificate holder to complete a			

- 1 board-approved four-hour course in health, safety, and infection control and state law. A
- 2 certificate holder is not licensed under this chapter as a cosmetologist, esthetician, or
- 3 manicurist. A facility at which a niche beauty services provider provides hairstyling and cosmetic
- 4 services is not subject to regulation under this chapter.
