- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 43-11-16.1 and section 43-11-25.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to internships and apprenticeship programs and international
- 3 applicants for licensure; to amend and reenact sections 43-11-01, 43-11-02, 43-11-11,
- 4 43-11-11.1, 43-11-12, 43-11-13, 43-11-14, 43-11-15, 43-11-16, 43-11-17, 43-11-19, 43-11-20.1,
- 5 43-11-20.4, 43-11-21, 43-11-22, 43-11-23, 43-11-24, 43-11-25, 43-11-26, 43-11-27, 43-11-27.1,
- 6 43-11-28, 43-11-29, 43-11-30, 43-11-31, 43-11-33, 43-11-34, and 43-11-35 of the North Dakota
- 7 Century Code, relating to the practice and licensure of cosmetologists, estheticians, and
- 8 manicurists; to repeal sections 43-11-13.1, 43-11-13.2, and 43-11-20 of the North Dakota

- 10 licensure, and student practice; and to provide a penalty.

The term includes the following or any one or a combination of these practices: 4 Hair care, including arranging, dressing, curling, waving, permanent waving, 5 cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, coloring, 6 straightening, or similar work, upon the hair of any individual by any means 7 or with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the 8 use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or 9 otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, 10 performing noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the 11 body, manipulation of eyelashes, or manicuring the nails of any individual; 12 (2)Skin care; 13 Manipulation and application of product to eyelashes and eyebrows, (3)14 including extensions, design, treatment, tinting, and lightening; 15 **(4)** Hair extensions using chemical hair joint agents, such as synthetic tape, 16 keratin bonds, or fusion bonds; and 17 <u>(5)</u> Manicuring. 18 The term does not include natural hair braiding or threading. 19 5. "Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a 20 cosmetologist is practiced. 21 6.4. "Esthetician" means an individual who is licensed by the board to engage in theunder_ 22 this chapter to practice of esthetics and skin care. 23 7. "Homebound" means an individual who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel to-24 a salon. "Esthetics" means manipulation and application of product to eyelashes and 25 8.5. 26 eyebrows, including extensions, design, treatment, tinting, and lightening and skin 27 care. 28 "Independent licensee" is a licensed individual who maintains a separate salon license 6. 29 and operates independently from the establishment owner in which the individual's 30 suite or chair is located.

1 "Instructor" means an individual who is at least eighteen years old, who is a licensed 2 cosmetologist, esthetician, or manicurist who teaches cosmetology, esthetics, 3 manicuring, or anyother practices taughtwithin the scope of the individual's license, in 4 a duly registered school of cosmetology, and who has met the requirements of section 5 43-11-27 and has applied for and received an instructor's license. 6 9.8. "Invasive care" means any procedure that invades the live tissue of the dermis, 7 including by any means, including cutting, puncturing, burning, insertion of 8 instruments, and includes: 9 a. Laser use; and 10 b. Chemical peels using: 11 Thirty percent or higher concentration of alpha hydroxy acid; 12 (2)Twenty percent or higher concentration of beta hydroxy acid; 13 (3) Two percent or higher concentration of resorcinol; 14 (4) Fifteen percent or higher concentration of trichloroacetic acid (TCA); or 15 Fifteen percent or higher concentration of phenol. 16 10.9. "Manicuring" means the cleansing: 17 <u>Cleansing</u>, cutting, shaping, <u>or</u> beautifying, or massaging of the hands, feet, or <u>a.</u> 18 nails; 19 Massaging from the elbow to the fingertips or knee to toes of any individual; b. 20 Caring for and treating the cuticles and nails; and <u>C.</u> 21 <u>d.</u> The application and removal of sculptured or otherwise artificial nails by hand or 22 with mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances. 23 "Manicurist" means an individual who is licensed by the board to engage in the under 11.10. 24 this chapter to practice of manicuring. 25 12.11. "Master cosmetologist" means an individual who has met the requirements of section 26 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managingmaster cosmetologist license. 27 13.12. "Master esthetician" means an individual who has met the requirements of section 28 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a master esthetician license. 29 13. "Master manicurist" means an individual who has met the requirements of section 30 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a master manicuring license.

"Student instructor" means a cosmetologist, esthetician, or manicurist who is receiving 9 instruction in teacher's training within the scope of the individual's license in a duly 10 registered school of cosmetology. 11 "Threading" means the method of removing hair from the eyebrows, upper lip, or other 19.22. 12 body part by using cotton thread to pull hair from follicles. 13 The term may include the use of an over-the-counter astringent, gel, and powder, 14 tweezers, and scissors, incidental to the removal of hair by threading. 15 The term does not include the use of chemicals, heat, or any type of wax. 16 "Tuition" means the total cost of a person's an individual's cosmetology studies, and 20.23. 17 does not include books or demonstration kits. 18 SECTION 2. Services in case of emergency. 23 2. Services provided by personsindividuals practicing cosmetology upon members of 24 theirthe individual's immediate families. 25 3. Services by a person licensed by the state and working within the standards and 26 ethics of that person's profession, if that person does not represent to the public that 27 the person is a cosmetologist or manicurist. 28 4.2. Services by nurses, undertakers, and morticians lawfully engaged in the performance 29 of the usual and ordinary duties of their vocation. 30 5.3. Educational activities conducted in connection with any regularly scheduled meeting or 31 any educational activities of any bona fide association of licensed cosmetologists,

1 estheticians, or manicurists from which the general public is excluded. For purposes of 2 this subsection, a "bona fide association of cosmetologists" means any organization 3 whose constitution, bylaws, or membership rules establish within said organization a 4 class of membership consisting of licensed cosmetologists. 5 6.4. Services provided by retailers or their sales personnel trained in the demonstration of 6 cosmetics application if the cosmetics are applied only with disposable applicators that 7 are discarded after each customer demonstration. The board may adopt rules to 8 ensure sanitary conditions for services provided under this exemption. 9 7.5. Services provided in a licensed hospital or a nursing home by a personan individual 10 practicing cosmetology on a volunteer basis without compensation or by a nurse's 11 assistant. 12 8.6. Skin care provided by a licensed cosmetologist or esthetician outside of a licensed 13 salon if the services are being provided under the supervision, control, and 14 responsibility of a physician or physician assistant practicing within the scope of the 15 physician's or physician assistant's license under chapter 43-17, or nurse practicing 16 within the scope of the nurse's license under chapter 43-12.1. 17 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 amended and reenacted as follows: 19 43-11-11. Sanitary rules Rules of cleaning and disinfecting - Practice outside salon. 20 The board with the approval of the state department of health shall adopt sanitary rules of 21 cleaning and disinfecting necessary to prevent the creating and spreading of infectious and 22 contagious diseases. A cosmetology salon must be at a fixed location and may not be used for-23 living or sleeping quarters. A cosmetologist or, esthetician, or manicurist may practice outside of 24 the establishment under the direction and control of a master cosmetologist or master-25 esthetician thereofa licensed salon under rules adopted by the board. The board shall inspect 26 salons to assure compliance with the rules of cleaning and disinfecting. 27 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.
