# REPORT OF PROCEDURAL COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER: Your procedural Rules Committee (Rep. Pollert, Chairman) recommends

that Joint Rule 805 be amended as follows and the amendment become effective after the end of all legislative business on March 12, 2021.

### **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Joint Rule 805 is amended as follows:

### 805. Public health.

- Except as provided in subsection 2, each Each individual in an area of the Capitol complex controlled by the Legislative Assembly, other than the chambers, shall wear a face mask or shield covering the nose and mouth completely, although the face mask or shield may be lowered or removed while speaking on the floor of the chamber after the member is recognized by the presiding officer. Areas controlled by the Legislative Assembly include the legislative chambers, committee rooms, Memorial Hall, Legislative Hall, the Legislative Council office, and any additional space the Legislative Assembly acquires for its use.
- 2. When <u>However</u>, <u>while</u> social distancing is maintained without exception, a member may remove the member's face mask or shield in areas of the <u>Gapitol complex</u> controlled by the <u>Legislative Assembly</u>. However, a face mask or shield must beworn by each member during floor sessions and for at least thirty minutes before and after each floor session at which the members are physically present. "Social distancing" means remaining at least six feet from all other individuals.
- 2. The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives or the Majority Leader of the Senate may reinstate the requirement to wear a face mask or shield under subsection 1 for that Majority Leader's respective chamber if the Majority Leader determines circumstances warrant the reinstatement.
- 3. Notwithstanding subsection 21, a committee chairman may requiredecide whether each individual in the chairman's committee room is required to wear a face mask or shield covering the nose and mouth completely, although a face mask or shield may be lowered or removed by an individual recognized by the chairman while the individual is addressing the committee during a meeting.
- 4. Consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines, it is recommended that members of the Legislative Assembly and legislative branch employees complete a health self assessment before arriving at the Capitol complex and undergo rapid testing for SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) when the testing is offered at the Capitol complex. Members of the Legislative Assembly and legislative branch employees shall submit to a temperature screening upon entering the Capitol complex. A member of the Legislative Assembly who has a temperature reading of 100.4 or greater or who is experiencing any symptoms of Coronavirus (COVID-19) COVID-19 shall report the temperature reading or existence of the symptoms to the member's party leader or designee immediately and comply with the protocols established jointly by the Majority and Minority Leaders. A legislative branch employee who has a temperature reading of 100.4 or greater or who is experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 shall report the temperature reading or existence of the symptoms to the director of the Legislative Council or the director's designee.

**SB 2275:** A BILL for an Act to provide for an appropriation to the department of human services relating to a director for the task force on prevention of sexual abuse of children.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Appropriations Committee**.

SB 2289: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the creation of a North Dakota scholarship; to amend and reenact sections 15-10-59, 15.1-21-02.6, 15.1-21-02.8, and 15.1-21-02.9 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to references to the North Dakota scholarship, North Dakota academic scholarship, and North Dakota career and technical education scholarship; to repeal sections 15.1-21-02.4 and 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota academic and career and technical education scholarships; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

**SB 2291:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 21-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to social investments made by the state investment board; to provide for a department of commerce study of the implications of complete divestment of companies that boycott energy or commodities; to provide for reports to legislative management; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

**SB 2313:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 17-05-05 and 17-05-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of the transmission authority and the transmission authority's reporting requirements; and to repeal chapter 17-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the 25x'25 initiative.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

**SB 2324:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 24-03-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to installation of culverts.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

**SB 2329:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 39-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of an authorized emergency vehicle.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

**SB 2344:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 37-17.1-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to governmental regulation of firearms and ammunition; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

### FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

**SCR 4001:** A concurrent resolution authorizing the Budget Section of the Legislative Management to hold the required legislative hearings on state plans for the receipt and expenditure of new or revised block grants passed by Congress.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Appropriations Committee**.

SCR 4009: A concurrent resolution recognizing the cooperative efforts of the rotary clubs and districts, and the citizens of multiple states from southern Texas to the far northern reaches of North Dakota and Saskatchewan, in the completion of marking the North Dakota segment of the Great Western Cattle Trail on June 27, 2021, and acknowledging the legendary role of the Great Western Cattle Trail in the history of the United States.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

**SCR 4012:** A concurrent resolution to establish a state policy to support the reliability and resilience of the electric grid, ensure price transparency to consumers in electric markets, and incentivize carbon capture utilization and storage as an alternative to

preserve dispatchable thermal electric generation and its associated benefits. Was read the first time and referred to the **Energy and Natural Resources Committee**.

**SCR 4013:** A concurrent resolution urging Congress to pass the North Dakota Trust Lands Completion Act.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

The House stood adjourned pursuant to Representative Louser's motion.
