POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE LOUSER

MR. SPEAKER: We often talk about the major high school sports champions at this time of year, but we rarely hear about swimming and diving. On Saturday, the Minot High boys team took home their twenty-ninth state title in the forty-seven year history of the competition in North Dakota. The Magi scored an amazing 433 points, outpacing the second place team, Fargo Davies, with 224 points. Coach Jake Solper led the team to their fourth straight title and the team won seven of the twelve events. Individual or relay state champions included: Dominic Yoder, Alex King, Josh Boen, Peyton Bartsch, Jaxon Reinke and Grant Schaeffer. I'm a bit partial to Grant Schaeffer, my nephew, who broke the school record while winning the 200-meter freestyle. The swimming talents stay within the immediate family as his brother Griffin's relay-team school record, from last season, was also broken on Saturday. As for the extended family, their uncles and cousins always wear life jackets on the pontoon. Congratulations to the Minot High boys swimming and diving team as the magician tradition continues.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE TROTTIER
