REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE SCHNEIDER

MR. SPEAKER: Within the past week, North Dakota lost a legal legend, Kermit Bye, age 84. He was a colleague and a friend, but more important, he was a Judge on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, the justice system court level just below the U.S. Supreme Court. Kermit was born on January 13, 1937, in the railroad section house in Hatton, North Dakota, as a blizzard made it impossible to get to a hospital. Kermit grew up in Hatton, as did his sweetheart and wife of 63 years, Carol Beth. He was very proud of being a 100% Norwegian Lutheran. Grandparents on both his mother's and father's sides immigrated from Norway. Kermit received his undergraduate degree in Business and Public Administration from the University of North Dakota in 1959 and his law degree with honors from the University of North Dakota School of Law in 1962. He was the first UND Law School graduate to be appointed as a United States Circuit Judge. Judge Bye began his legal career working for the State of North Dakota as a Deputy Securities Commissioner, then

served as a special assistant attorney general in this building. Kermit later became an assistant U.S. attorney for the District of North Dakota until he joined the Vogel Law firm in Fargo in 1968. Kermit practiced law with dedication and integrity in both federal and state trial and appellate courts from 1968 until 2000. He was nominated by President Clinton to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit and unanimously approved by the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee and the U.S. Senate. Judge Bye assumed the Circuit Court bench in 2000 and went to senior status in 2015. Judge Bye served on the United States Judicial Conference Advisory Committee on Appellate Rules and on the Eighth Circuit Judicial Council as chair of the Court Reporter Management Committee and the Rules Committee. Judge Bye was a past President of the State Bar Association of North Dakota, and received its Distinguished Service Award. He was also president of the Western States Bar Conference and the National Caucus of State Bar Associations. Judge Bye was a longtime leader in the American Bar Association, and a member of its Board of Governors. He represented the judges and lawyers of North Dakota as North Dakota's State Delegate to the ABA House of Delegates. Kermit was a member of the Executive Board of the Central and East European Law Initiative, bringing the rule of law to those in other countries. In North Dakota he was a member of the Lions Club, Sons of Norway, the Rotary Club, and the Elks Club. Kermit also served on numerous boards of businesses, civic and philanthropic organizations. Some of those included: (1) vice chairman and founding member of the Board of Trustees of the Hope Lutheran Church Foundation, (2) a founder and member of the Board of Directors of the North Dakota State University Hockey Club. (3) Advisory Board Chair and a founder of the North Dakota Small Business Investment Company, (4) a Director of the Greater North Dakota Association, (5) State Executive Board member of U.S. West (now CenturyLink) Communications, (6) Director of the Southeast Mental Health Center, and (7) Chair of Red River Human Services Foundation in Fargo. Judge Bye was a mentor and supporter for many young attorneys, and a role model of character and legal skill. He will be both remembered and missed.

¹ Funding is adjusted to provide for employee salary increases of 1.5 percent on July 1, 2021, with a minimum monthly increase of \$100, and an increase of 2 percent on July 1, 2022. The House provided funding for salary increases of 1.5 percent on July 1, 2021, and July 1, 2022, with a minimum monthly increase of \$100 and a maximum monthly increase of \$250.

This amendment also provides the statutory changes to increase the State Treasurer's salary. The State Treasurer's annual salary is increased from the current level of \$110,582 to \$112,241, effective July 1, 2021, and to \$114,486, effective July 1, 2022, to reflect the 1.5 percent and 2 percent salary increase respectively. The House provided for a 1.5 percent annual salary increase.

² Funding of \$12,000 is added for membership dues, which were removed to meet the budget reduction guidelines. The House did not add funding for membership dues.
