FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Sens. Dwyer, Bakke, Conley, Kannianen, Rust, Wanzek introduced:

SCR 4011: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to establish a 1776 Commission and urging the United States Department of Education and the North Dakota Superintendent of Public Instruction to develop educational materials that will provide education for students in accordance with the principles of the founding of America, the unifying ideals stated in the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and other founding documents.
