Section 8 creates a new section to Chapter 4.1-01 to transfer the international business and trade office, also known as the North Dakota Trade Office, from the Department of Commerce to the Agriculture Commissioner.

Section 9 amends Section 54-60-29 to expand the continuing appropriation provided to the Department of Commerce from the UAS fund for expenses of the UAS program to also include expenses of the beyond visual line of sight UAS program and the enhanced use lease grant program.

Section 10 repeals Section 54-60-16 related to the international business and trade office, also known as the North Dakota Trade Office, as part of the transfer of the program from the Department of Commerce to the Agriculture Commissioner.

Section 11 provides an exemption for unexpended 2017-19 biennium funds continued into the 2019-21 biennium for the beyond visual line of sight UAS program to continue into the 2021-23 biennium. The 2019 Legislative Assembly provided a \$28 million supplemental appropriation from the general fund for this purpose for the 2017-19 biennium. The Department of Commerce may provide grants of up to \$28 million to the Department of Transportation, pursuant to the appropriation in Section 3, for the purpose of defraying tower infrastructure construction expenses of the beyond visual line of sight UAS program during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 12 provides an exemption for the UAS program to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds for the operating expenses of this program into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$2.25 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

Section 13 provides an exemption for the enhanced use lease grant program to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds for the program into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$3 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

Section 14 provides an exemption to continue unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds for the early childhood education program into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$1.5 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

#### House Version

Section 10 creates a new section to Chapter 4.1-01 to transfer the international business and trade office, also known as the North Dakota Trade Office, from the Department of Commerce to the Agriculture Commissioner.

Section 11 amends Section 54-34.3-13 to remove the requirement that businesses be "primary sector" businesses to qualify for the rural growth incentive program, which is administered by the North Dakota Development Fund in the rural growth incentive fund.

Section 12 amends Section 54-60-29 to expand the continuing appropriation provided to the Department of Commerce from the UAS fund for expenses of the UAS program to also include expenses of the beyond visual line of sight UAS program and the enhanced use lease grant program.

Section 13 repeals Section 54-60-16 related to the international business and trade office, also known as the North Dakota Trade Office, as part of the transfer of the program from the Department of Commerce to the Agriculture Commissioner.

Section 14 provides an exemption for unexpended 2017-19 biennium funds continued into the 2019-21 biennium for the beyond visual line of sight UAS program to continue into the 2021-23 biennium. The 2019 Legislative Assembly provided a \$28 million supplemental appropriation from the general fund for this purpose for the 2017-19 biennium. The Department of Commerce may provide grants of up to \$5 million to the Department of Transportation, pursuant to the appropriation in Section 3, for the purpose of defraying infrastructure construction expenses of the beyond visual line of sight UAS program during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 15 provides an exemption for the UAS program to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds for the operating expenses of this program into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$2.25 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

Section 16 provides an exemption for the enhanced use lease grant program to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds for the program into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$3 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

Section 15 provides an exemption to continue \$320,000 of the \$500,000 appropriated from the general fund for the nonresident nurse employment recruitment program for the 2019-21 biennium into the 2021-23 biennium. In addition to the program eligibility guidelines established for the 2019-21 biennium, the Department of Commerce is required to provide funding for the program to eligible nursing students in the state who have not been employed by a health care provider on a full-time basis in the year preceding the grant award.

Section 16 provides an exemption for discretionary funds to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds in the discretionary funds line item into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$2.15 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

## House Version

Section 17 provides an exemption to continue \$320,000 of the \$500,000 appropriated from the general fund for the nonresident nurse employment recruitment program for the 2019-21 biennium into the 2021-23 biennium. In addition to the program eligibility guidelines established for the 2019-21 biennium, the Department of Commerce is required to provide funding for the program to eligible nursing students in the state who have not been employed by a health care provider on a full-time basis in the year preceding the grant award.

Section 18 provides an exemption for discretionary funds to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium funds in the discretionary funds line item into the 2021-23 biennium. A total of \$2.15 million was appropriated from the general fund to the department for this purpose for the 2019-21 biennium.

Section 19 provides legislative intent that the Northern Plains UAS Test Site maximize earned revenue when possible.

Section 20 provides for the Legislative Management to consider studying data storage by state entities. The study must include input from the Information Technology Department, North Dakota University System, and K-12 Education Coordinating Council. The study must consider data security, geographical locations of storage, geographical location of corporate contractors, state and federal laws that may affect North Dakota data, ownership and control of data storage, and current and estimated data storage costs related to cloud-based, out-of-state data storage of North Dakota state and local government data.

Section 21 declares this Act to be an emergency.
