Additional income

Section 3 would appropriate any additional income from the resources trust fund or water development trust fund that becomes available to the State Water Commission during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 3 provides that in addition to the amounts appropriated to the State Water Commission from the resources trust fund, any additional amounts that become available in the fund are appropriated, subject to Budget Section approval, to the State Water Commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Water Commission for the 2021-23 biennium.

Exemption - Water-related projects

Executive Budget Recommendation

Section 4 would provide that funds appropriated for grants or waterrelated projects in Section 1 are exempt from North Dakota Century Code Section 54-44.1-11 for 2 years after June 30, 2023. Any unexpended funds appropriated from the resources trust fund or the water development trust fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the originating fund.

Carryover funding reports - Legislative Management

Bank of North Dakota - Line of credit

Section 6 would extend authorization of a line of credit at the Bank of North Dakota, not to exceed \$75 million, at an annual percentage rate of 1.5 percent over the 3-month LIBOR rate, but may not exceed 3 percent to the State Water Commission. The State Water Commission must repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund, water development trust fund, or other funds, as appropriated by the Legislative Assembly. The State Water Commission may access the line of credit, as necessary, to provide funding as authorized by the Legislative Assembly for water supply and flood control projects approved for funding before June 30, 2023.

Western Area Water Supply - Revenue bonds

Appropriation - Pilot project - Implementation of a basinwide plan

Directive - Fargo flood control project - Legislative intent

Directive - Mouse River flood control project funding - Legislative intent

Section 4 provides that the remaining \$22,000,000 in the capital assets line item and \$295,363,183 in the project carryover line item are exempt from North Dakota Century Code Section 54-44.1-11 for 2 years after June 30, 2023. This section also authorizes the State Water Commission to obtain approval from the Emergency Commission and Budget Section to increase carryover authority of funding from previous bienniums. This section also provides that any unexpended funds appropriated from the resources trust fund or the water development trust fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the originating fund.

Section 5 requires the State Water Commission to report on carryover projects to Legislative Management on a quarterly basis. This section also provides that the committee may make a recommendation to the State Water Commission if projects listed should be terminated persuant to Section 61-02-14.3.

Section 6 extends authorization of a line of credit at the Bank of North Dakota, not to exceed \$75 million, at an annual percentage rate of 1.5 percent over the 3-month LIBOR rate, but may not exceed 3 percent to the State Water Commission. The State Water Commission must repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund, water development trust fund, or other funds, as appropriated by the Legislative Assembly. The State Water Commission may access the line of credit, as necessary, to provide funding as authorized by the Legislative Assembly for water supply and flood control projects approved for funding before June 30, 2023. Add restriction for use on federal reimbursment project

Section 7 creates a new section to Chapter 61-40 authorizing the Western Area Water Supply to issue revenue bonds.

Section 8 provides that \$1,100,000 is to provide up to \$1 million in grants to water resource districts to develop basinwide water plans and up to \$100,000 in the form of grants for local administrative costs associated with the implementation of a basinwide plan.

Section 9 limits the total state funds approved by the State Water Commission for the Fargo flood control project to \$850 million and provides legislative intent the state provide a portion of the local cost-share of the Fargo flood control project not to exceed \$850 million. The section provides legislative intent that of the \$850 million, the state has provided \$414.5 million and the remaining \$435.5 million is to be provided from bond proceeds during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 10 provides that excluding funding provided for Mouse River flood control projects prior to the 2021-23 biennium, the total state funds approved by the State Water Commission to total \$604 million. The section provides legislative intent that of the \$604,000,000, \$74,500,000 is provided from the resources trust fund through bond proceeds used to repay outstanding loans of the resources trust fund during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 7 authorizes the transfer of \$75 million of proceeds from a Bank of North Dakota line of credit to the State Water Commission during the 2021–23 biennium.

Section 11 provides legislative intent that the state provide up to \$1.6 million to the system 4 connection to system 1 a rural water supply project sponsored by All Seasons Water District, in addition to any funds approved for the project by the State Water Commission in previous bienniums, during the 2021-23 biennium.

Section 12 directs the State Water Commission along with the stakeholders of the Red River Valley Water Supply Project to study which entity would be best to manage the project.

Section 13 provides legislative intent that the state does not own or operate NAWS and provides for a Legislative Management study in conjunction with the State Water Commission, to study which entity would be best to own, manage, and operate NAWS.

Section 14 declares the bill to be an emergency measure.
