**SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 15-11-39 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4. The consortium may contract with a third party in conducting the duties of the consortium and may seek, receive, and accept from any source aid or contributions of money, property, labor, or other things of value to be held, used, and applied to carry out the purposes of the consortium. The university of North Dakota may assess each nursing program in this state which is a member of the consortium, in proportion to each program's enrollment, for the costs of administering the nursing education consortium. Any money received by the consortium as assessments, gifts, grants, or donations is appropriated as a continuing appropriation for the purpose of funding the simulation laboratory program and the activities of the consortium."

During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying higher education student affordability, including all forms of financial assistance available for students enrolled at institutions of higher education in the state. The study must include a review of available scholarships, student loan programs, waivers, grants, and any other forms of student financial assistance available for students enrolled at institutions of higher education in the state. The study must also include a review of the eligibility requirements and other criteria relating to each program, and their impact on the financial cost and utilization of each program. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.

**SECTION 27. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - HIGHER EDUCATION FUNDING STABILIZATION.** During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall study higher education funding mechanisms, including private-public partnerships and distributions from permanent funds. The study must include potential mechanisms to stabilize funding for higher education, including funding mechanisms used in other states. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly."
