

Why did DHS establish a Work Group in this situation?

LSSND was contracted to provide several critical services on behalf of the state. The **state** has a **responsibility** to assure uninterrupted delivery of these services.

LSSND provided a wide array of human services n communities across North Dakota and, in many cases, was the **only provider** of a particular service in a community.

WORK GROUP GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- Minimize disruption of core services
- Ensure safety for children and adults receiving behavioral health and addiction/recovery services
- Transition core staff for state-required services to DHS temporarily, to allow for longer-term solutions to be identified
- Evaluate efficiency and effectiveness of contracted services to guide future procurement



EARLY CHILDHOOD SYSTEM INFRASTRUCTURE

Programs:

Child Care Aware Bright & Early Growing Futures

Coaching, training, workforce development, quality improvement for child care providers; parent resource and referral services

Funding:

Child Care Development Block Grant

Impact:

3 provider-oriented data systems; 33 staff





BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Programs:

Project Renew Crisis Counseling response line for behavioral health needs related to pandemic

Funding:

SAMHSA and FEMA Crisis Counseling Assistance

Impact:

5-7 staff temporarily connected to DHS to avoid interruption in availability of behavioral health crisis resource

Programs:


Gambler's Choice

Funding:

State Special Funds (lottery)

Impact:

4 staff temporarily connected to DHS to avoid disruption in specialized addiction services



REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT COORDINATION

Programs:

Refugee Medical Assistance Refugee Cash Assistance Refugee Support Services

Wrap-around services for resettled refugees.

Funding:

Office of Refugee Resettlement (U.S. Dept of HHS)

<u>Impact:</u>

DHS re-assumes responsibility for state refugee coordination; 8-10 staff temporarily connected to DHS to facilitate program administration





URM FOSTER CARE

Programs:

Unaccompanied Refugee Minor (URM) Foster Care

Licensed foster care program that is fully federally funded to serve unaccompanied children

Funding:

Office of Refugee Resettlement

<u>Impact:</u>

7-9 staff temporarily connected to DHS to ensure continued service to 40 foster children in 25 licensed foster homes
