I believe there is a need for a 2021-2022 interim study examining the ability of providers and regulating agencies to adapt to the unique and changing needs of the persons we serve and the environments we operate in. It is important that Legislators examine recently enacted policy and rule and make sure it is having its intended effect and effectively using the funding available for these programs.
