10	<u>1.</u>	The	director, deputy director, chief game wardens, or district game wardens have the		
11		pow	ver of a peace officer in the following circumstances:		
12	1.	<u>a.</u>	To enforce state laws and rules on any game refuge, game management area, or		
13			other land or water owned, leased, or managed by the department and, on		
14			sovereign lands as defined by section 61-33-01, and on state-owned lands		
15			managed by the board of university and school lands as defined in sections		
16			<u>15-06-01</u> and <u>15-07-01</u> .		
17	2.	<u>b.</u>	When responding to requests from other law enforcement agencies or officers for		
18			aid and assistance. For the purposes of this subsectionsubdivision, a request		
19			from a law enforcement agency or officer means only a request for assistance as		
20			to a particular and singular violation or suspicion of violation of law, and does not		
21			constitute a continuous request for assistance outside the purview of		
22			enforcement of the provisions of this title.

8	SEC	CTION 2. Section 15-08-28 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as

10	15-0	08-28. Vehicular access.			
11	The	use of vehicles on trust lands is prohibited, except:			
12	1.	Within thirty-three feet [10.06 meters] of section lines;			
13	2.	As allowed by the terms of a lease, permit, or easement issued by the board of			
14		university and school lands;			
15	3.	When used for travel on a public road easement issued by the board;			
16	4.	When used by government personnel in the performance of official duties; or			
17	5.	When hunting under a special permit issued by the director of the game and fish			
18		department to shoot from a stationary vehicle and with written permission from the			
19		lessee and commissioner.			
20	SEC	CTION 3. Section 15-08-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as			
21	follows:

23	1.	Nonvehicular public access to leased and unleased trust lands is allowed if in the best			
24		interests of the trusts, unless:			
25		a. Specifically prohibited by the commissioner; or			
26		b. A lessee of any lands under the control of the board of university and school			
27		lands posts the land with signage issued by the department, which:			
28		(1) Requires notification to the lessee before entry by the public; or			
29		(2) Closes the trust lands to all public access.			
30	2.	A lessee of any lands under the control of the board may not lease, sell, or otherwise

1	SECTION 4. Section 15-08-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as				
2	follows:				
3	15-0	15-08-30. Prohibited activities.			
4	The	The following activities and items are prohibited on trust lands:			
5	1.	Target shooting, explosives, and exploding targets;			
6	2.	Camping, picnicking, or campfires;			
7	3.	Unattended trail cameras, hunting blinds, tree stands, and screw-in steps unless			
8		otherwise authorized by the commissioner of university and school lands;			
9	4.	Using bait to attract, lure, feed, or habituate wildlife for any purpose. For purposes of			
10		this subsection "bait" includes grains, screenings, minerals, salt, fruits, vegetables,			
11		hay, or any other natural or manufactured feeds, but not the use of lures, scents, or			
12		liquid attractants for hunting;			
13	5.	Disturbing or removing artifacts or any cultural, historical, archeological, or			
14		paleontological resources found on trust lands without written permission from the			
15		board of university and school lands;			
16	6.	Disposing of refuse, including garbage, bottles, cans, trees, branches, or other waste			
17		materials;			
18	7.	Dog training:			
19	8.	Metal detecting:			
20	9.	Guiding and outfitting;			
21	10.	Collecting plant parts for sale or other commercial purposes;			
22	11	Trapping, unless authorized in writing by the commissioner;			
23	12.	Tree cutting and firewood gathering, unless authorized in writing by the commissioner;			
24	<u>13.</u>	Beehives, unless specifically authorized in a surface land lease; and			
25	<u>14.</u>	Organized events for which the commissioner has not issued a written agreement or			
26		permit in accordance with section 15-08-31.			
27	SEC	CTION 5. Section 15-08-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as			
28	follows:				

1	15-08-31. Organized event.
2	1. Upon written request, the commissioner of university and school lands may allow by
3	written agreement or permit, an organized event involving public access or activity on
4	trust lands if the event:
5	a. Is an appropriate use of trust lands;
6	b. Does not damage trust lands;
7	c. Does not have a negative impact on the value or financial return of the trust lands
8	in violation of the board of university and school land's fiduciary duty to the
9	applicable trusts as determined by the commissioner;
10	d. Protects the state from liability and other claims for damage; and
11	e. Has been approved by the current surface land lessee, if the trust lands are
12	<u>leased.</u>
13	2. The commissioner may refuse to issue or renew a permit if the permit applicant has
14	repeatedly violated the provisions of this chapter or rules or orders of the
15	commissioner.
16	SECTION 6. Section 15-08-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as
17	follows:
18	15-08-32. Penalty.
19	Any person who willfully violates sections 15-08-28, 15-08-29, and 15-08-30 is guilty of a
20	class B misdemeanor.
