
Southwest Pipeline Project 2021-2023 Biennium Proposed Funding Needs

2021-2023 Proposed Funding Needs were submitted for the Water Development Plan prior to the downturn in the Resources Trust Fund revenue. The Main Transmission Line (MTL) Capacity Upgrades from the Ray Christensen Pump Station to Belfied, Davis Buttes, and New England Reservoirs with an estimated project cost of \$8.3 Million are not funded in the current biennium. The MTL Upgrades remain a need for Southwest Water Authority and the Southwest Pipeline Project.





- Quality drinking water is SWA's top priority 365 days a year, 24/7

- Approaching \$11 million to the Resources Trust Fund per biennium
