BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. EMERGENCY COMMISSION AUTHORIZATION ADJUSTMENTS -

APPROPRIATION. The amounts identified in the emergency commission authorization column below represent the federal coronavirus relief fund spending authority approved for each agency or institution by the emergency commission and budget section under section 54-16-04.1 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021. The director of the office of management and budget shall adjust the federal coronavirus relief fund spending authorization amount for each agency and institution to the amounts shown in the appropriation column which are appropriated from federal funds derived from the federal coronavirus relief fund to the agency or institution listed for the purpose of defraying expenses relating to the COVID-19 pandemic for the period beginning June 18May 15, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

This amendment adjusts funding allocations from the federal Coronavirus Relief Fund as follows:

- Reduces allocations for various agencies by a total of \$108,044,073 based on estimated unused allocation authority.
- Makes a technical correction for allocations to the Department of Trust Lands and Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.
- Allocates an additional \$523,194 to the State Treasurer for distribution to political subdivisions.
- Allocates \$18,315 to the Office of Management and Budget for audit costs.
- Allocates \$4 million to the Industrial Commission for well plugging and reclamation costs.
- Authorizes the Department of Commerce to utilize previously allocated funding for costs associated with collecting previously distributed funds.

This amendment also appropriates federal funding to be received under the federal American Rescue Plan Act and other federal funding as follows:
