- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 50-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to access to long-term care facilities in case of a declaration of disaster or emergency;
- 3 and to declare an emergency.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 50-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>50-10.3-01. Definitions.</u>
- 8 As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 <u>1. "Declaration of disaster or emergency" means a disaster or emergency declared by</u>
  10 <u>the governor under chapter 37-17.1.</u>
- 11 <u>2. "Department" means the department of human services.</u>
- 12 3. "Designated caregiver" means an individual, whether a family member or friend of a resident of a long-term care facility, who is designated by the resident or appointed by an individual with decisionmaking authority for the resident to provide in-person physical, spiritual, or emotional support to the resident during a declaration of disaster or emergency.
  - 4. "Long-term care facility" means a skilled nursing facility, basic care facility, assisted living facility, or swing-bed hospital approved to furnish long-term services.

- This chapter does not supersede federal authority regarding long-term care facilities or
- 21 prevent the department or state department of health from taking necessary actions to render
- 22 the state eligible for federal funds or reimbursement services provided in long-term care
- 23 facilities.
