Senators Burckhard, Anderson, Heitkamp, Kannianen, Larson, Lee, and Oban,

For the record NDCEL which represents North Dakota school leaders including your school Superintendents, Principals, and other administrators and directors stand opposed to this bill.

Locally elected officials and the individuals who operate our schools must have the intrinsic authority to make local decisions that can most positively impact the communities they serve. This is a basic tenant that North Dakotan's have strongly believed in for many years. This bill truly eliminates that ability and is a real example of the very overreach the bill may be trying to prevent.
