- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the attorney general for purposes of conducting
- 2 a foreign adversaries threat assessment; and to provide for a legislative management report.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION GENERAL FUND ATTORNEY GENERAL FOREIGN
- 5 ADVERSARY THREAT ASSESSMENT REPORT ONE-TIME FUNDING LEGISLATIVE
- 6 MANAGEMENT REPORT.

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- 1. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, there is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$7,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the attorney general for the purpose of contracting with a consultant to perform a comprehensive assessment of the state's vulnerabilities relating to security threats posed by foreign adversaries. The funding provided in this subsection is considered a one-time funding item.
- 14 2. The consultant shall:
 - a. Identify sectors and industries most vulnerable to foreign adversarial influence, including critical infrastructure, technology, agriculture, energy, and academia;
 - Assess foreign adversarial influence beyond land acquisition, including strategic investments, partnerships, and other forms of economic, educational, and political influence;
 - c. Evaluate existing investments and activities to determine compliance with federal, state, and local laws;
 - d. Identify sectors in which foreign adversarial influence is often unmonitored or under reported; and

1 Propose broad mitigation strategies relating to identified risks and vulnerabilities 2 to enhance the state's ability to manage foreign adversarial influence while 3 supporting economic growth and security. 4 By June 1, 2026, the consultant shall provide a written report to the attorney general 3. 5 outlining its findings and recommendations. The report must: Provide a detailed analysis of the foreign adversary threats and vulnerabilities 6 a. 7 specific to the state; 8 Identify critical risks across sectors, including infrastructure, security, academia, b. 9 and economic investments; 10 Provide sector specific mitigation recommendations designed to reduce 11 vulnerabilities in infrastructure, academic institutions, economic investments, and 12 other prominent sectors in the state; and 13 d. Include a proposal providing for the establishment of a state intelligence unit and 14 the structure, roles, and operational procedures required for continuous 15 monitoring of foreign adversary threats by the state intelligence unit. 16 4. Before July 1, 2026, the attorney general shall present the findings and 17 recommendations provided in the report under subsection 3, and any proposed 18 legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the legislative
