- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public health
- 2 division of the department of health and human services; to create and enact a new section to
- 3 chapter 54-27 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the deposit of judgment funds; to
- 4 provide for a legislative management report; to provide for a transfer; and to provide for an
- 5 exemption.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of health and human services for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the public health division of the department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as follows:

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1 appropriations committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time 2 funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. 3 SECTION 3. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION - REPORT. 4 Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of management and budget shall 5 transfer appropriation authority between line items within section 1 of this Act, subdivisions 1, 2, 6 and 3 of section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2012, and any other appropriation authority for the 7 department of health and human services approved by the sixty-eighth legislative assembly for 8 the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as requested by the 9 department of health and human services. The department of health and human services shall 10 notify the legislative council of any transfer made pursuant to this section. The department shall 11 report to the budget section after June 30, 2024, any transfer made in excess of \$50,000 and to 12 the appropriations committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly regarding any transfers 13 made pursuant to this section. 14 SECTION 4. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION - REPORT. 15 Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of management and budget shall 16 transfer appropriation authority from line items within section 1 of this Act, subdivisions 1, 2, 17 and 3 of Senate Bill No. 2012, and any other appropriation authority for the department of 18 health and human services approved by the sixty-eighth legislative assembly to subdivision 4 of 19 Senate Bill No. 2012, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as 20 requested by the department of health and human services. The department of health and 21 human services shall notify the legislative council of any transfer made pursuant to this section. 22 The department shall report to the budget section after June 30, 2024, any transfer made in 23 excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly 24 regarding any transfers made pursuant to this section. 25 SECTION 5. TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATION AUTHORITY. Section 1 of this Act and 26 section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2012 includes appropriation authority for the department of health 27 and human services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. On 28 July 1, 2023, the office of management and budget shall combine the appropriation authority 29 contained in section 1 of this Act and section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2012, and any other 30 appropriation authority for the department of health and human services in other bills approved

by the sixty-eighth legislative assembly, into one budget for the department of health and human

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services. The department of health and human services shall submit one budget request for the 2 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. 3 SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - INSURANCE TAX DISTRIBUTION FUND. The 4 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$1,125,000 from the 5 insurance tax distribution fund for rural emergency medical services grants. 6 SECTION 7. ESTIMATED INCOME - COMMUNITY HEALTH TRUST FUND. The estimated 7 income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$20,837,620 from the community 8 health trust fund for the following programs: 9 \$200,000 Behavioral risk factor survey 10 Behavioral health loan repayment 234,500 11 Domestic violence offender treatment 1,000,000 12 Domestic violence prevention 1,000,000 13 Women's way 329,500 14 Dentists' loan repayment 360,000 15 Local public health state aid 3,275,000 16 580,324 Cancer programs 17 Forensic examiner contract 1,000,000 18 Tobacco cessation grants 500,000 19 Youth vaping prevention grants 300,000 20 Tobacco prevention and control 5,043,000 21 Tobacco prevention and control grants to local public health units 6,250,000 22 Total community health trust fund \$20,072,324 23 SECTION 8. ESTIMATED INCOME - FEDERAL STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND. The 24 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$55,120,000 from federal 25 funds derived from the state fiscal recovery fund for a public health laboratory capital project. 26 SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 54-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 27 and enacted as follows: 28 Deposit of JUUL Labs, Inc., judgment funds. 29 Eighty percent of any funds received by the state under the consent judgment adopted by 30 the south central judicial district court in its consent judgment entered December 8, 2022, [Civil

JUUL Labs, Inc., 2 must be deposited in the community health trust fund. 3 SECTION 10. TRANSFER - ATTORNEY GENERAL REFUND FUND TO COMMUNITY 4 **HEALTH TRUST FUND.** The attorney general shall transfer eighty percent of any funds 5 deposited in the attorney general refund fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and 6 ending June 30, 2023, relating to the consent judgment entered December 8, 2022, [Civil 7 No. 08-2022-CV-02972] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Drew H. Wrigley v. JUUL Labs, Inc., to 8 the community health trust fund on July 1, 2023. 9 SECTION 11. USE OF PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE GRANT FUNDS. The public 10 health division of the department of health and human services shall use \$870,000 of funding 11 made available through the federal COVID-19 public health crisis response grant for public 12 health workforce to provide grants to local public health units. To be eligible to receive a grant, 13 local public health units must apply for this grant funding by December 31, 2023. Any public 14 health workforce funds not awarded to local public health units may be used by the department 15 of health and human services for workforce efforts pursuant to federal grant guidance. 16 SECTION 12. LABORATORY BUILDING STEERING COMMITTEE. The department of 17 health and human services shall establish a laboratory building steering committee to oversee 18 the design and construction of the laboratory building project for the biennium beginning July 1, 19 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The committee must include representation from the 20 department of health and human services, department of environmental quality, office of 21 management and budget, the governor's office, and the legislative assembly. The legislative 22 assembly representation must include one member of the senate appointed by the senate 23 majority leader, one member of the house appointed by the house majority leader, and one 24 member of the minority party from either the senate or the house appointed by the minority 25 leaders of the senate and the house. 26 SECTION 13. EXEMPTION - 2021-23 BIENNIUM APPROPRIATION - STATEWIDE 27 **HEALTH STRATEGIES.** The sum of \$3,000,000, of which \$1,500,000 is from the community 28 health trust fund and \$1,500,000 is from other income derived from matching funds, 29 appropriated for statewide health strategies in section 1 of chapter 32 of the 2021 Session 30 Laws, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this

appropriation are available for statewide health strategies initiatives during the biennium

- 1 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The amount appropriated from the
- 2 community health trust fund is contingent on the department of health and human services
- 3 securing dollar-for-dollar matching funds.
- 4 SECTION 14. EXEMPTION 2021-23 BIENNIUM APPROPRIATION PUBLIC HEALTH
- 5 **LABORATORY CAPITAL PROJECT.** The sum of \$15,000,000 of federal funds, derived from
- 6 the state fiscal recovery fund, appropriated for a public health laboratory capital project in
- 7 subdivision 7 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws, is not
- 8 subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation
- 9 are available for the public health laboratory capital project during the biennium beginning
- 10 July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.
