1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and North Dakota vision services -

3 school for the blind; and to provide an exemption.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the department of public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, 9 and North Dakota vision services - school for the blind for the purpose of defraying the 10 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 11 2025, as follows:

1 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$433,020,000, 2 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is 3 from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund 4 that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of 5 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 6 2025. 7 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND. The

8 estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of

9 \$143,454,500 from the foundation aid stabilization fund for integrated formula payments.

10 SECTION 5. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

11 **CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.** The superintendent of public instruction may 12 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education 13 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for paying grants for educational 14 services that were due in the 2021-23 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly 15 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2023. To be reimbursed under this 16 section, claims must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public 17 instruction by June 30, 2024.

18 SECTION 6. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM. The sum of \$800,000, included in the 19 integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be 20 distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented 21 programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines 22 adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction 23 shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and 24 special education units.

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SECTION 7. MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING AND SCHOOL APPROVAL -

26 WITHHOLDING AND DISTRIBUTION.

27 1. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of 28 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for 29 students participating in the Medicaid program for the biennium beginning July 1. 30 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. Special education funds equal to the amount of the 31

1		be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of health and	
2		human services on behalf of the school district or unit.	
3	2.	State school aid payments for integrated formula payments must be reduced by the	
4		amount of funds required to be paid by school districts for school approval for the	
5		biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.	
6	SEC	TION 8. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION. The	
7	integrate	d formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$500,000	
8	from the	general fund for the purpose of providing annual grants to regional education	
9	associat	ions for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. An annual	
10	grant of	\$35,714 is provided to each regional education association that exists as of July 1,	
11	2023. Regional education associations that merge during the 2023-25 biennium are entitled to		
12	the annu	al grants that would have been paid to each of the member associations.	
13	SEC	TION 9. EXEMPTION - GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FEES AND	
14	DISPLA	CED HOMEMAKER DEPOSITS. Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the department	
15	of public	instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account. In addition,	
16	any mon	eys collected by the department of public instruction for general educational	
17	developr	nent fees and displaced homemakers deposits must be deposited in the public	
18	instructio	on fund in the state treasury. Any funds deposited in the public instruction fund may only	
19	be spent	subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.	
20	SEC	TION 10. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The grants line item in subdivision 2 of	
21	section 2	l of this Act includes \$1,737,582 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than	

22 one-half may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024.
