1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish

2 department; to provide a contingent appropriation; to provide for a transfer; and to provide an

3 exemption.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 9 game and fish department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, 10 as follows:

9	for the 2025-27 biennium. The game and fish department shall report to the appropriations			
10	committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the			
11	biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.			
12	SECTION 3. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS LINE ITEM. The grants, gifts, and			
13	donations line item in section 1 of this Act includes up to \$100,000 received by the game and			
14	fish department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation on department-owned or			
15	managed properties as a result of mineral exploration and extraction activities.			
16	SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION AND FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT			
17	POSITIONS - RECOVERING AMERICA'S WILDLIFE ACT. Subject to the provisions of this			
18	section, there is appropriated from federal funds, the sum of \$27,150,000, or so much of the			
19	sum as may be necessary, to the game and fish department for the purpose of administering			
20	programs approved under the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act, for the biennium			
21	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The department is authorized seven full-time			
22	equivalent positions for this purpose. The funding and positions authorized in this section are			
23	available only upon passage of the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act.			
24	SECTION 5. EXEMPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS.	Notwithstanding sec	tion 54-16-04,	
25	the director of the office of management and budget shall transfer up to \$2,000,000 of			
26	appropriation authority between the operating expenses, capital assets, and grants - game and			
27	fish line items in section 1 of this Act as requested by the game and fish department during the			
28	piennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The game and fish department			
29	shall notify the legislative council of any transfers made pursuant to this section.
