1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish

2 department; to provide a contingent appropriation; to provide for a transfer; and to provide an

3 exemption.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 9 game and fish department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, 10 as follows:

6 The 2023-25 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget 7 for the 2025-27 biennium. The game and fish department shall report to the appropriations 8 committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the 9 biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

SECTION 3. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS LINE ITEM. The grants, gifts, and donations line item in section 1 of this Act includes up to \$100,000 received by the game and fish department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation on department-owned or managed properties as a result of mineral exploration and extraction activities.

14 SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION AND FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT

15 POSITIONS - RECOVERING AMERICA'S WILDLIFE ACT. Subject to the provisions of this 16 section, there is appropriated from federal funds, the sum of \$27,150,000, or so much of the 17 sum as may be necessary, to the game and fish department for the purpose of administering 18 programs approved under the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act, for the biennium 19 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The department is authorized seventhree 20 full-time equivalent positions for this purpose. The funding and positions authorized in this 21 section are available only upon passageenactment of the federal Recovering America's Wildlife 22 Act and after corresponding federal funds have been made available to the state. The 23 department shall regularly coordinate with and consider input from the federal environmental 24 law impact review committee in the expenditure of funds for conservation or research under this 25 section. If the contingent funding in this section becomes effective, the department may request 26 the office of management and budget to transfer up to \$641,480 from the new and vacant FTE. 27 funding pool for salaries and wages of the full-time equivalent positions identified in this section. 28 SECTION 5. MIDTERM CONSERVATION AGREEMENTS. The game and fish department 29 may spend up to \$2,777,778 from other funds in the land habitat and deer depredation line item 30 in section 1 of this Act for midterm conservation agreements with private landowners. The 31 department shall limit the term of these agreements to a maximum of fifteen years.

1 SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04,

- 2 the director of the office of management and budget shall transfer up to \$2,000,000 of
- 3 appropriation authority between the operating expenses, capital assets, and grants game and
- 4 fish line items in section 1 of this Act as requested by the game and fish department during the
- 5 biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The game and fish department
- 6 shall notify the legislative council of any transfers made pursuant to this section.
