- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to COVID-19 vaccinations and emergency-use authorized vaccines for
- 3 students at institutions of higher education; and to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section
- 4 23-07-17.1 and section 23-12-20 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school and day
- 5 care immunizations and COVID-19 vaccination and infection information.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
8 and enacted as follows:

9 <u>COVID-19 and emergency-use authorized vaccinations - Limitations.</u>

- 10 <u>1.</u> <u>An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may not:</u>
- 11a.Require a student to be vaccinated against severe acute respiratory syndrome12coronavirus 2, identified as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) or receive an
- emergency-use authorized vaccine, as a condition of enrollment or in-person
 attendance.
- 15 <u>b.</u> Promote student vaccination against COVID-19 or receipt of an emergency-use
 authorized vaccine.

17 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 23-07-17.1 of the North Dakota

- 18 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- A child may not be admitted to any public, private, or parochial school, or day care
 center, child care facility, head start program, or nursery school operating in this state
- 21 or be supervised through home-based instruction unless the child's parent or guardian
- 22 presents to the institution authorities a certification from a licensed physician or
- 23 authorized representative of the department of health and human services that the

11	par	ent or legal guardian shall file the certification with the public school district in which
12	the	child resides.

1		(2) The presence of COVID-19 pathogens, antigens, or antibodies; or

3	2.	Subsection 1 does not apply to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, a
4		correctional facility as defined under section 12-44.1-01, the state hospital, or a public
5		health unit.
6	3.	A private business located in this state or doing business in this state may not require
7		a patron, client, or customer in this state to provide any documentation certifying
8		COVID-19 vaccination, the presence of COVID-19 pathogens, antigens, or antibodies,
9		or COVID-19 post-transmission recovery to gain access to, entry upon, or services
10		from the business. This subsection does not apply to a developmental disability
11		residential facility or a health care provider, including a long-term care provider, basic
12		care provider, and assisted living provider. As used in this subsection, a private
13		business does not include a nonprofit entity that does not sell a product or a service.
14	4.	This section may not be construed to interfere with an individual's rights to access that
15		individual's own personal health information or with a person's right to access personal
16		health information of others which the person otherwise has a right to access.
17	5.	Subsection 1 is not applicable to the state board of higher education, the university
18		system, or institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to the
19		extent the entity has adopted policies and procedures governing the type of
20		documentation required, the circumstances under which such documentation may be
21		shared, and exemptions from providing such documentation.
22	6.	This section is not applicable during a public health disaster or emergency declared in
23		accordance with chapter 37-17.1.
24	7.	As used in this section, the term "COVID-19" means severe acute respiratory
25		syndrome coronavirus 2 identified as SARS-CoV-2 and any mutation or viral
26		fragments of SARS-CoV-2.
