- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 11-11-05, 15.1-09-30, 40-06-02, 49-01-07,
- 2 54-16-01, and 54-17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the recitation of the
- 3 pledge of allegiance.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 11-11-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 11-11-05. Meetings of board Time and place <u>- Pledge of allegiance</u>.
- 8 The board of county commissioners shall meet and hold regular meetings for the 9 transaction of business at a time and place to be designated by the commission on a date 10 certain established by resolution or ordinance of the commission. The county auditor shall have 11 power to call special meetings when the interests of the county demand it. The chairman of the
- 12 board, or a majority of the members thereof, may call special meetings that must be noticed in
- 13 accordance with section 44-04-20. <u>At the beginning of each regularly scheduled meeting, board</u>
- 14 members must be given the opportunity to participate in a voluntary recitation of the pledge of
- 15 <u>allegiance.</u>

16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **15.1-09-30. School boards - Meetings - Pledge of allegiance**.

- Each school board shall hold an initial meeting during the month of July following the
 annual election. The president of the school board shall select a meeting date that is
 convenient to the other board members and shall provide board members with written
 notice of the meeting.
- 23 2. Once during each month thereafter, a board shall hold a regular meeting for the
 24 transaction of business. The board of any school district having only one-room and

- two-room schools may meet as often as the board deems necessary, but not less than
 four times in each year.
- 3 3. Special meetings may be called by the president or by any two members of a board.
 Written notice of a special meeting must be given to each member of a board.
- At the beginning of each regularly scheduled school board meeting, board members
 must be given the opportunity to participate in a voluntary recitation of the pledge of
 allegiance.
- 8 <u>5.</u> The attendance of a board member at any meeting, without objection, constitutes a
 9 waiver of the notice requirement for that member.
- 5.6. A board of a school district operating under an academic cooperative agreement
 approved by the superintendent of public instruction may participate in multiboard
 meetings in addition to, instead of, or in conjunction with the regular board meetings
 required by this section. Multiboard meetings must be for the purpose of pursuing joint
 academic or cooperative activities and must be held at the times and locations agreed
- 15 to by the presidents of the participating boards. In addition to any other requirements
- 16 set forth in section 44-04-20, the presidents of each school board shall ensure that
- 17 notice of each multiboard meeting in which the school board will participate is
- published in the local newspapers of general circulation at least one week before themeeting date.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 40-06-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

22 40-06-02. Meetings to be public - Journal of proceedings to be kept - Pledge of

- 23 <u>allegiance</u>.
- All meetings of the governing body shall be open to the public, and a journal of its
- 25 proceedings shall be kept. <u>At the beginning of each regularly scheduled meeting of the</u>
- 26 governing body, members of the governing body must be given the opportunity to participate in
- 27 <u>a voluntary recitation of the pledge of allegiance.</u>
- 28 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is

29 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 49-01-07. Proceedings of public service commission <u>- Pledge of allegiance</u>.

2 The commission in all cases may conduct its proceedings, when not otherwise particularly 3 prescribed by law, in a manner most conducive to the proper dispatch of business and to the 4 ends of justice. A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of 5 business, but a commissioner shall not participate in any hearing or proceeding in which that 6 commissioner has any direct personal pecuniary interest. The commission from time to time 7 may make or amend such general rules or orders as may be requisite for the orderly regulation 8 of proceedings before it, including forms of notice and the service thereof, which shall conform 9 as nearly as possible to those in use in the courts of this state. Any party may appear before the 10 commission and may be heard in person or by attorney. Every vote and official action of the 11 commission shall be entered of record and its proceedings shall be public upon the request of 12 any person interested. The commission shall have an official seal, which shall be judicially 13 noticed, and every commissioner shall have the right to administer oaths and affirmations in any 14 proceeding pending before the commission. At the beginning of each regularly scheduled 15 meeting of the commission, members must be given the opportunity to participate in a voluntary 16 recitation of the pledge of allegiance. 17 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 54-16-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 amended and reenacted as follows: 19 54-16-01. Emergency commission - Members - Organization - Quorum - Meetings -20 Pledge of allegiance. 21 The emergency commission consists of the governor, the majority leaders of the senate and 22 house of representatives of the legislative assembly, the secretary of state, and the chairmen of 23 the senate and house of representatives appropriations committees. If the chairman of an 24 appropriations committee ceases to be a member of the legislative assembly, the vice chairman 25 of that committee succeeds to that position on the commission. An appropriations committee

26 vice chairman may serve in the place of the appropriations committee chairman as a member of

- 27 the commission at the request of the appropriate appropriations committee chairman, if the
- 28 appropriations committee chairman is unable to attend a commission meeting. If a majority
- 29 leader ceases to be a member of the legislative assembly, the respective house's assistant
- 30 majority leader succeeds to that position on the commission. A majority leader's assistant
- 31 majority leader may serve as a member of the commission in the place of the majority leader at

1 the request of the majority leader if that majority leader is serving on the commission in another

2 capacity or is unable to attend a commission meeting. Four members of the commission

3 constitute a quorum. The governor is the chairman and the secretary of state is the secretary of

4 the commission. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman. <u>At the beginning of</u>

5 <u>each regularly scheduled meeting of the emergency commission, members must be given the</u>

6 opportunity to participate in a voluntary recitation of the pledge of allegiance.

7 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 54-17-02. Industrial commission - Members - Quorum - Meetings - Pledge of

10 <u>allegiance</u>.

11 The industrial commission of North Dakota shall consist of the governor, the attorney

12 general, and the agriculture commissioner. The governor and one member constitute a quorum

13 for the transaction of business. The meetings of the commission must be held at such times and

14 places as the governor or a majority of the commission may determine. It must be provided by

15 the proper authorities with suitably furnished offices at the seat of government. <u>At the beginning</u>

16 of each regularly scheduled meeting of the industrial commission, members must be given the

17 opportunity to participate in a voluntary recitation of the pledge of allegiance.
