- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 <u>Century Code, relating to the agriculture infrastructure grant program;</u> to amend and reenact
- 3 section 4.1-01.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the agriculture diversification
- 4 and development fund; to provide an appropriation for the agriculture diversification and
- 5 development fund; and to provide for a transfer.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 8 and enacted as follows: 9 Agriculture infrastructure grant program. 10 The agriculture commission, in consultation with the director of the department of 1. 11 transportation, shall develop policies to administer the agriculture infrastructure grant 12 program to include a grant application process and eligibility criteria. 13 2. The agriculture commissioner, in consultation with the director of the department of 14 transportation, shall award grants to political subdivisions for road and bridge 15 improvements necessary to accommodate value-added agriculture businesses. Grant 16 funding under this subsection may be used for: 17 Corridor improvements on county and township roadways; and a. 18 Improvements to roads or bridges that provided access to value-added b. 19 agriculture businesses. 20 3. The agriculture commissioner shall award grants to entities for water and sewer line 21 improvements and electrical and gas supply improvements necessary to 22 accommodate value-added agriculture businesses. 23 Grants awarded under this section may not exceed: 4.

| 13 | 1.     | There is created in the state treasury the agriculture diversification and development               |
| 14 |        | fund. The fund consists of all moneys transferred to the fund by the legislative                     |
| 15 |        | assembly, interest upon moneys in the fund, and payments of interest and principal on                |
| 16 |        | loans made from the fund. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the Bank of North                   |
| 17 |        | Dakota on a continuing basis for loan disbursements, grants, and administrative costs                |
| 18 |        | pursuant to this section. No more than twenty-five percent of the fund may be utilized               |
| 19 |        | for grants in a biennium, and moneys in the fund are appropriated to the agriculture                 |
| 20 |        | commissioner on a continuing basis for grants pursuant to this section and section 1 of              |
| 21 |        | this Act. The agriculture diversification and development committee shall designate the              |
| 22 |        | amount available from the fund for loans, interest rate buydowns, and grants.                        |
| 23 | 2.     | Loans, interest rate buydowns, or grants <u>under subsections 3 and 4</u> may be issued              |
| 24 |        | from the fund to support new or expanding value-added agriculture businesses that                    |
| 25 |        | demonstrate financial feasibility, enhance profitability for farmers and ranchers, create            |
| 26 |        | jobs, and grow the state's economy. <u>Grants under <del>subsection 5</del>section 1 of this Act</u> |
| 27 |        | may be issued from the fund for infrastructure improvements necessary for the                        |
| 28 |        | development or expansion of new or existing value-added agriculture businesses.                      |
| 29 |        | Value-added agriculture businesses include food production or processing facilities;                 |
| 30 |        | feed or pet food processing facilities; commodity processing facilities; agriculture                 |

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product manufacturers; and animal agriculture production facilities, including swine, poultry, dairy, and feed lot production facilities.

3 3. The Bank of North Dakota shall develop policies for loans and interest rate buydowns 4 from the fund in consultation with the agriculture diversification and development 5 committee. The Bank shall review loan applications. To be eligible for a loan under this 6 section, an entity shall agree to provide the Bank with information as requested. The 7 Bank may develop policies for loan participation with local financial institutions. The 8 Bank shall deposit in the fund all principal and interest paid on the outstanding loans. 9 The Bank may use a portion of the interest paid as a servicing fee to pay for 10 administrative costs, which may not exceed one-half of one percent of the amount of 11 the outstanding loans. The Bank shall contract with a certified public accounting firm to-12 audit the fund if the fund has any loans. The fund must be audited annually pursuant 13 to section 6-09-29, and the cost of the audit must be paid from the fund.

- Based on recommendations from the agricultural diversification and development
  committee, the agriculture commissioner shall distribute the grant funding.
- 19 The agricultural diversification and development committee shall develop policies for 5. 20 grants from the fund to political subdivisions, individuals, or organizations for-21 infrastructure improvements necessary for the development or expansion of new or-22 existing value-added agriculture businesses, including eligibility criteria and reporting-23 requirements. Grants to political subdivisions are limited to one million two hundred 24 fifty thousand dollars per project and may not exceed eighty percent of the 25 infrastructure improvement costs. Grants to individuals or organizations are limited to 26 three hundred fifty thousand dollars and may not exceed eighty percent of the 27 infrastructure improvement costs. Eligible uses of grant funding include water and 28 sewer line improvements and electrical and gas supply improvements. Grant funding-29 may not be used for routine maintenance or operating costs. Based on-
- 30 recommendations from the agricultural diversification and development committee, the
  - agriculture commissioner shall distribute the grant funding.

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SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO AGRICULTURE DIVERSIFICATION
 AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in
 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$30,000,000\$25,000,000, which the
 office of management and budget shall transfer to the agriculture diversification and
 development fund, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.Of
 the \$30,000,000\$25,000,000, up to \$10,000,000 is available for agriculture infrastructure grants
 to political subdivisions.
