## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2201**

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact-subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-03,

2 subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-04, subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 19-24.1-14,

3 sections 19-24.1-15 and 19-24.1-16, subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-18, subdivision a of

4 subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-18, and subsection 1 of section 19-24.1-24 of the North Dakota

5 Century Code, relating to medical marijuana certification and application criminal history record

6 <u>check</u> fees; and to provide for a legislative management study regarding the administrative

7 costs of medical marijuana compassion center certification and the impact of those costs on

8 patients.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 11 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-03 of the-12 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 13 -a. A nonrefundable application fee in an amount not to exceed fiftytwenty-five-14 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-04 of the North dollars. 15 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 16 Except as provided in section 19-24.1-04.1, a criminal history record check conducted 3. 17 under section 12-60-24 must be performed upon initial application and biennially 18 thereafter and at any other time upon the request of the department. All fees 19 associated with the criminal history record check must be paid by the 20 applicantdepartment. 21 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 19-24.1-14 of the 22 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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1	a. A nonrefundable application fee, not to exceed five thousand three thousand five
2	hundred dollars, made payable to the "North Dakota Department of Health and
3	Human Services, Medical Marijuana Program".
4	- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amended and reenacted as follows:
6	— 19-24.1-15. Compassion centers - Registration.
7	
8	eligible for registration, the applicant shall submit all of the following additional items to
9	the department to qualify for registration:
10	a. A certification fee, made payable to the "North Dakota Department of Health and
11	Human Services, Medical Marijuana Program", in an amount not to exceed
12	ninetysixty-five thousand dollars for a dispensary and one hundred teneighty
13	thousand dollars for a manufacturing facility.
14	b. A financial assurance or security bond to ensure the protection of the public-
15	health and safety and the environment in the event of abandonment, default, or
16	other inability or unwillingness to meet the requirements of this chapter.
17	c. The physical address of the proposed compassion center; confirmation the
18	information in the application regarding the physical location of the proposed
19	compassion center has not changed, and if the information has changed the
20	department shall determine whether the new information meets the requirements-
21	of this chapter; and a current certificate of occupancy, or equivalent document, to-
22	demonstrate compliance with the provisions of state and local fire code for the
23	physical address of the proposed compassion center. It is not necessary for an
24	applicant to resubmit any information provided in the initial application unless
25	there has been a change in that information.
26	d. An update to previously submitted information, including information about
27	compassion center agents and compliance with section 19-24.1-18.

1	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
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5	compassion center may submit a renewal application at any time beginning ninety
6	calendar days before the expiration of the registration certificate. A compassion center-
7	shall submit a renewal application a minimum of sixty calendar days before the
8	expiration of the registration certificate to avoid suspension of the certificate.
9	
10	calendar days of submission, if the following conditions are satisfied:
11	a. The compassion center submits a renewal fee, in an amount not to exceed
12	ninetysixty-five thousand dollars for a dispensary and one hundred teneighty
13	thousand dollars for a manufacturing facility, which the department shall refund if-
14	the department rejects the renewal application;
15	b. The compassion center submits a complete renewal application;
16	
17	for violation of this chapter;
18	d. Inspections conducted under this chapter do not raise any serious concerns
19	about the continued operation of the compassion center; and
20	e. The compassion center continues to meet all the requirements for the operation
21	of a compassion center as set forth in this chapter and rules adopted under this-
22	chapter.

24	may not issue a registration certificate and the department shall provide the
25	compassion center with written notice of the determination. If a compassion center's
26	certificate is not renewed, the compassion center shall dispose all marijuana and
27	usable marijuana in accordance with rules adopted under this chapter.

14	f. The agent's signature and the date.
15	g. A nonrefundable application or renewal fee innot to exceed the amount of two-
16	hundred dollars.
17	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-18 of the
18	North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
19	a. All applicable fees associated with the required criminal history record checks
20	must be paid by the compassion center or the agentdepartment.
21	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 19-24.1-24 of the North Dakota
22	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
23	1. A manufacturing facility shall grow an amount of marijuana sufficient to meet the
24	qualifying patient population demands. For every five hundred plants in excess of one
25	thousand plants a manufacturing facility possesses, the manufacturing facility shall
26	pay the department an additional certification fee of ten thousand seven thousand five
27	hundred dollars. This fee is due at the time of increase and again at renewal of the
28	compassion center registration certificate under section 19-24.1-16.
29	SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - COMPASSION CENTER
30	CERTIFICATION. During the 2023-24 interim, the legislative management, in collaboration with
31	the department of health and human services, shall study the administrative costs involved in

- 1 certifying a compassion center. The study must include information on the amount and
- 2 frequency of certification fees, a description of additional costs associated with certification, an
- 3 explanation of how the department uses the certification fees once they are collected, a
- 4 recommendation of the best way to lower administrative costs while maintaining the integrity of
- 5 the department's medical marijuana program, and a prediction on whether the lowering of
- 6 administrative costs will help to lower consumer costs on medical marijuana purchased from a
- 7 compassion center. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations
- 8 to the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
