- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-17 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a fertilizer development fund; to provide for a legislative management
- 3 report; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows:
- 7 Fertilizer development fund Fertilizer development council Access to council
- 8 records Industrial commission powers Legislative management report Continuing
- 9 appropriation.

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- 1. There is created in the state treasury the fertilizer development fund. The fund consists of all moneys transferred to the fund by the legislative assembly; interest upon moneys in the fund; and donations, grants, and other contributions received by the commission for deposit in the fund. All moneys in the fund are appropriated to the commission on a continuing basis to provide grants and other financial assistance and for administrative and operating costs of the fertilizer development council pursuant to this section.
 - 2. To be eligible for a grant or financial assistance from the fund, the fertilizer development project must be located within the state, and the owner of the fertilizer development project must be an entity domiciled in the United States or Canada.

 Grant awards and financial assistance are limited to twenty percent of the estimated project costs before the start of construction of the fertilizer plant. Fifty percent of the grant awards and financial assistance must be designated for one or more fertilizer

development projects that use hydrogen produced by the electrolysis of water. Fifty
