4	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is							
5	amended and reenacted as follows:							
6	15.1-18-10. Specialty areas - Teacher qualification. (Effective through July 31, 2023)

8	1.	An individual may teach art, business education, computer education, a foreign

20		education permitteaching authorization if the individual:				
21		a. Is currently enrolled in a bachelor's program with a major in special education;				
22		b. Has successfully completed all professional education coursework, special				
23		education major-specific coursework, and student teaching; and				
24		c. Has passed the tests required by the education standards and practices board,				
25		including the content area test.				
26	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
