AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 4.1-11-01 of the North Dakota Century 10 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 "Council" means the nongovernmental entity, known as the North Dakota soybean 12 council. 13 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 4.1-11-08. Council members - Compensation. 16 Each member of the council is entitled to receive compensation in the amount established 17 by the council but not exceeding one hundred thirty-five dollars per day plus reimbursement for 18 expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is attending meetings or 19 performing duties directed by the council. 20 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 4.1-11-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is-21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 4.1-11-10. Council duties and reports. 23

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1	2. The council shall develop and disseminate information regarding the purpose of the
2	soybean assessment and ways in which the assessment benefits soybean producers.
3	3. The council shall determine the uses for which any moneys raised under this chapter
4	may be expended. The uses may include the funding of research, education
5	programs, and market development efforts, as well as participation in programs under
6	the auspices of national soybean promotion organizations.
7	4. Annually, the council shall prepare and submit a report summarizing the activities of
8	the council to the state auditor and the commissioner. The report must show all
9	income, expenses, and other relevant information concerning fees collected and
10	<u>expended.</u>
11	5. The council shall request and submit a certificate of good standing, issued by the
12	secretary of state, as part of the report described in subsection 4.
13	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	amended and reenacted as follows:
15	— 4.1-11. Assessment.
16	Anlf a federal assessment under the Soybean Promotion, Research, and Consumer
17	Information Act [Pub. L. 101-624; 104 Stat, 3881; 7 U.S.C. 92 et seq.] or similar act remains in
18	place, a state assessment under this section is prohibited. If the Soybean Promotion, Research,
19	and Consumer Information Act [Pub. L. 101-624; 104 Stat, 3881; 7 U.S.C. 92 et seq.] or similar
20	act eliminates a federal assessment, the council shall implement a state assessment equaling
21	one-half of one percent of the value of the sale must be imposed upon all soybeans sold to a
22	designated handler.
23	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24	amended and reenacted as follows:
25	4.1-11-12. Collection of assessment by designated handler - Records.
26	1. If an assessment is in place under section 4.1-11-11:
27	1. Each designated handler shall collect the assessment from the seller by deducting the
28	assessment from the purchase price of all soybeans subject to the assessment.;
29	2. Each designated handler shall keep all records regarding the quantity of soybeans
30	received and assessed for a period of three years.; and
31	3. All records required by this section may be examined by the council upon request.

1	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	4.1-11-13. Quarterly report - Submission to council.
4	At the time and in the manner prescribed by the council, each designated handler shall file
5	with the council a quarterly report stating the quantity of all soybeans that the handler
6	purchased and assessed under section 4.1-11-11.
7	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	amended and reenacted as follows:
9	4.1-11-14. Submission of assessments - Civil penalty Delinquent assessment.
10	Each designated handler shall forward to the council all assessments collected by the
11	handler under section 4.1-11-11 within thirty days after the end of each calendar quarter. If a
12	designated handler fails to submit the assessments as required by this section, the council shall
13	increase the amount owed by two percent each month, beginning with the day following that on-
14	which the assessments came due.
15	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	amended and reenacted as follows:
17	4.1-11-15. Continuing appropriation Use of council funds.
18	The council shall forward all All moneys received under this chapter to the state treasurer for
19	depositmust be deposited in the soybean fund. All moneys in the soybean fund are appropriated
20	on a continuing basis to the council toaccount at the Bank of North Dakota and may be used
21	exclusively to carry outby the council for the payment of claims by the council based upon
22	obligations incurred in the performance of council activities, functions, and purposes as
23	provided in this chapter. The board shall segregate moneys in the soybean checkoff account
24	from all other moneys of the council.
25	SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2024.
26	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 4.1-44-04 of the North Dakota Century
27	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
28	2. The presiding officer of each house of the legislative assembly may direct the reports
29	be filed with some other standing committee of that house. Each report must contain a
30	summary of the activities of the commodity group during the current biennium, and a
31	single-page uniform statement of revenues and expenditures for the next biennium.

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Each report, except the reports of the North Dakota beekeepers association and the North Dakota turkey federation, also must include a state an auditor's report on the commodity group's single-page uniform statement of revenues and expenditures for the previous two fiscal years or an annual federal financial statement audit required due to a federally mandated checkoff associated with the group's national association.

SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Commodity groups - Certain groups exempt.

A commodity group required to present a state auditor's report under section 4.1-44-04 is exempt from this chapter if the commodity group is subject to a federal audit due to a federally mandated checkoff associated with the group's national association.
