1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to state audits of commodity groups; and to amend and reenact-
- 3 subsection 2 of section 4.1-44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 4 presentation of state audit reports. for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section
- 5 4.1-11-01, sections 4.1-11-08, 4.1-11-10, 4.1-11-11, 4.1-11-12, 4.1-11-13, 4.1-11-14, and
- 6 <u>4.1-11-15, and subsection 1 of section 4.1-44-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to</u>
- 7 the North Dakota soybean council and the North Dakota soybean fund; and to provide an
- 8 <u>effective date.</u>

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 4.1-44-04 of the North Dakota Century 11 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 12 2. The presiding officer of each house of the legislative assembly may direct the reports-13 be filed with some other standing committee of that house. Each report must contain a 14 summary of the activities of the commodity group during the current biennium, and a 15 single-page uniform statement of revenues and expenditures for the next biennium. 16 Each report, except the reports of the North Dakota beekeepers association and the 17 North Dakota turkey federation, also must include a statean auditor's report on the 18 commodity group's single-page uniform statement of revenues and expenditures for-19 the previous two fiscal years or an annual federal financial statement audit required-20 due to a federally mandated checkoff associated with the group's national association. 21 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 22 and enacted as follows:

5	SEC	CTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 4.1-11-01 of the North Dakota Century	
6	Code is	amended and reenacted as follows:	
7	1.	"Council" means the nongovernmental entity, known as the North Dakota soybean	
8		council.	
9	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
10	amended and reenacted as follows:		
11	4.1-	11-08. Council members - Compensation.	
12	Eac	h member of the council is entitled to receive compensation in the amount established	
13	by the c	ouncil but not exceeding one hundred thirty-five dollars per day plus reimbursement for	
14	expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is attending meetings or		
15	performing duties directed by the council.		
16	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
17	7 amended and reenacted as follows:		
18	4.1-11-10. Council duties and reports.		
19	1.	The council shall develop policies and initiate programs to promote the development of	
20		markets for and increase the utilization of soybeans grown in this state.	
21	2.	The council shall develop and disseminate information regarding the purpose of the	
22		soybean assessment and ways in which the assessment benefits soybean producers.	
23	3.	The council shall determine the uses for which any moneys raised under this chapter	
24		may be expended. The uses may include the funding of research, education	
25		programs, and market development efforts, as well as participation in programs under	
26		the auspices of national soybean promotion organizations.	
27	4.	Annually, the council shall prepare and submit a report summarizing the activities of	
28		the council to the state auditor and commissioner. The report must show all income,	
29		expenses, and other relevant information concerning fees collected and expended.	
30	5.	The council shall request and submit a certificate of good standing, issued by the	
31		secretary of state, as part of the report described in subsection 4.	

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1	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
2	amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	4.1-11-11. Assessment.		
4	AnIf a federal assessment under the Soybean Promotion, Research, and Consumer		
5	Information Act [Pub. L. 101-624; 104 Stat, 3881; 7 U.S.C. 92 et seq.] or a similar act remains in		
6	place, a state assessment under this section is prohibited. If the Soybean Promotion, Research,		
7	and Consumer Information Act [Pub. L. 101-624; 104 Stat, 3881; 7 U.S.C. 92 et seq.] or similar		
8	act eliminates a federal assessment, the council shall implement a state assessment equaling		
9	one-half of one percent of the value of the sale must be imposed upon all soybeans sold to a		
10	designated handler.		
11	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
12	amended and reenacted as follows:		
13	4.1-11-12. Collection of assessment by designated handler - Records.		
14	1. If an assessment is in place under section 4.1-11-11:		
15	1. Each designated handler shall collect the assessment from the seller by deducting the		
16	assessment from the purchase price of all soybeans subject to the assessment $f_{\pi_{a}}$		
17	2. Each designated handler shall keep all records regarding the quantity of soybeans		
18	received and assessed for a period of three years . ; and		
19	3. All records required by this section may be examined by the council upon request.		
20	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
21	amended and reenacted as follows:		
22	4.1-11-13. Quarterly report - Submission to council.		
23	At the time and in the manner prescribed by the council, each designated handler shall file		
24	with the council a quarterly report stating the quantity of all soybeans that the handler		
25	purchased and assessed <u>under section 4.1-11-11</u> .		
26	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
27	amended and reenacted as follows:		
28	4.1-11-14. Submission of assessments - Civil penaltyDelinquent assessment.		
29	Each designated handler shall forward to the council all assessments collected by the		
30	handler <u>under section 4.1-11-11</u> within thirty days after the end of each calendar quarter. If a		
31	designated handler fails to submit the assessments as required by this section, the council shall		

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1	increase the amount owed by two percent each month, beginning with the day following that on			
2	which the assessments came due.			
3	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-11-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
4	amended and reenacted as follows:			
5	4.1-11-15. Continuing appropriation - Use of council funds.			
6	The council shall forward allAll moneys received under this chapter to the state treasurer for			
7	deposit <u>must be deposited</u> in the soybean fundcheckoff account at the Bank of North Dakota. All			
8	moneys in the soybean fundcheckoff account are appropriated on a continuing basis to the			
9	council toand may be used exclusively to carry outby the council for the payment of claims by			
10	the council based on the obligations incurred in the performance of council activities, functions,			
11	and purposes as provided in this chapter. The board shall segregate moneys in the soybean			
12	checkoff account from all other moneys of the council.			
13	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 4.1-44-03 of the North Dakota Century			
14	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:			
15	1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state treasurer shall invest in			
16	accordance with section 21-10-07 all available moneys in:			
17	a. The potato fund;			
18	b. The oilseed fund;			
19	c. The dry bean fund;			
20	d. The dry pea and lentil fund;			
21	e. The barley fund;			
22	f. The soybean fund;			
23	gThe corn fund;			
24	<mark>h.</mark> g. The honey fund;			
25	i. <u>h.</u> The turkey fund;			
26	<u>j-i.</u> The milk marketing fund;			
27	k.j. The dairy promotion commission fund;			
28	L <u>k.</u> The state wheat commission fund;			
29	m. <u>l.</u> The ethanol fund; and			
30	n.m. The North Dakota beef commission fund.			
31	SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2024.
