The proposed bill provides a definition for out-of-state guard member and will provide an out-of-state guard member the license, permit and application fee to be the same as a resident.

4 - Fiscal Impact Sections Detail

The proposed bill creates a new section to chapter 20.1-03 that would provide an out-of-state guard member the license, permit and application fee to be the same as a resident in sections 20.1-03-12, 20.1-03-12.2, 20.1-03-12.3 and 20.1-03-36.1.

The proposed bill will also amend the following sections:

20.1-03-07.1: The private lands open to sportsmen program will lose revenue (\$40 per nonresident who is an out-of-

state guard member) for statewide nonresident waterfowl hunting license.

20.1-04-12.1 #4d: A professional gun dog trainer who is an out-of-state guard member will pay a \$10 fee for training exercises or hosting field trials, instead of the \$100 nonresident fee (20.1-04-12.1 #4b).

20.1-04-12.1 #4e: An amateur who brings more than 4 dogs into this state who is an out-of-state guard member will pay a \$10 fee, instead of the \$25 nonresident fee (20.1-04-12.1 #4c).

20.1-06-14 #2: An individual holding an annual class B nonresident license who is an out-of-state guard member will pay a \$50 fee, except the fee is \$75 if white suckers are sold, instead of the \$250 nonresident fee (20.1-03-12 #43). 20.1-06-14 #3: An individual holding an annual class A nonresident license who is an out-of-state guard member will pay a \$50 fee, except the fee is \$75 if white suckers are sold, instead of the \$250 nonresident fee (20.1-03-12 #43).

Per the ND National Guard (NDNG), the number of current NDNG members who have a home of record outside ND is 1,454. The NDNG stated they do not track former members home of record.

We anticipate the fiscal impact of the proposed bill to be significant, but it is difficult to calculate as we do not know how many current or former out-of-state guard members will purchase or apply for these licenses. If passed, this bill would take affect at the beginning of the 2024 season.

The proposed bill will require programming changes to the Game and Fish online licensing system. We estimate a one-time cost of \$50,000 for significant development and programming costs to custom program exceptions for each license.

This bill will not allow online licensing for these individuals since paperwork would need to be received and verified before issuing licenses similar to current procedures. These licenses would need to be issued by the Bismarck office either by mail or in person. This will require additional staff time to process these licenses; however, the additional time is difficult to estimate.
