Funding for this program is not included in the Governor's recommended budget, but is identified from Bank of North Dakota profits in House Bill No. 1031.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>There is no ongoing appropriation for the career builders program, however there is funding available for the program for the 2023-25 biennium in the skilled workforce student loan repayment and scholarship funds, from which the state board of higher education has continuing appropriation authority. In its July 2022 report on the career builders program, the University System office estimated \$3.5 million would be available for spending during the 2023-25 biennium from the scholarship and loan repayment funds, however a portion of that funding may be obligated to continue awards for current recipients.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>Approximately \$2.1 million of ongoing funding from the general fund was provided to the Department of Public Instruction in 2019 for the teacher shortage loan forgiveness program. Although the funding for the program has not been removed by the Legislative Assembly, the department has reallocated the funds to other areas of its budget, leaving \$0 available for the program for the 2023-25 biennium.
