



# TITLE IV-E INDIVIDUAL ELIGIBILITY

To determine eligibility, an application must be completed through an online process. It gathers information on whether a child may be at risk of out-of-home placement based on circumstances and characteristics of the family as a whole and/or circumstances and characteristics of the child or the parent/caregiver's ability to safely care for and nurture the child.

## CHILD ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- 17 years old and under (post-natal);
- North Dakota resident;
- Not in an open foster care program or under the custody of a public agency (Human service zone, Division of Juvenile Services, or tribal social services); and
- At risk of out-of-home placement if preventative services are not offered.

If the child has met the above criteria, a determination of eligibility must be met. Federal guidance defines an eligible child as a candidate for foster care.

Once a child is determined eligible, services can also be delivered to the child's caregivers.

# CHILDREN & FAMILY SERVICES

## Children Eligible for Title IV-E Prevention Services

MUST meet the following criteria:

- 17 years and under (post-natal);
- North Dakota resident;
- Not in an open foster care program or under the custody of a public agency (Exception: A youth who is pregnant or parenting);
- In a home of a parent/caregiver; and
- At risk of out of home placement if preventative services are not offered.
