1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to the membership of the public employees retirement system board; to provide for

3 duties of the public employees retirement system and public employees retirement system

4 board; to provide an exemption; to provide for retroactive application; and to provide an effective

5 date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 54-52-03. Governing authority.

- 101.A state agency is hereby created to constitute the governing authority of the system to11consist of a board of nineeleven individuals known as the retirement board. No more12than one elected member of the board may be in the employ of a single department,13institution, or agency of the state or in the employ of a political subdivision. An
- 14 employee of the public employees retirement system or the state retirement and
- 15 investment office may not serve on the board.
- 16 1. Two
- 17 <u>2.</u> Four members of the legislative assembly must be appointed by the chairman of the
 18 legislative management to serve on the board.
- 19a.If the same political party has the greatest number of members in both the house20and senate, one member must be from that majority party and one member from21the political party with the next greatest number of members in the house and22senate.

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	b. If the same political party does not have the greatest number of members in both-
	the house and senate, one member must be from the majority party in the house-
	and one member must be from the majority party in the senate.
2.	One member The majority leader of the house of representatives shall appoint two
	members of the house of representatives and the majority leader of the senate shall
1	appoint two members of the senate. The members appointed under this subsection
	shall serve a term of two years. A member appointed under this subsection serves at
	the pleasure of the appointing majority leader.
<u>3.</u>	Four members of the board must be appointed by the governor to serve a term of
	fivetwo years, for no more than a total of six years. The Each appointee under this
	subsection must be a North Dakota citizen who is not a state or political subdivision
	employee and who by experience is familiar with money managementretirement and
	employee benefit plans. The governor shall appoint one citizen member is to serve as
	chairman of the board. A member appointed under this subsection serves at the
	pleasure of the governor.
3.<u>4.</u>	One member of the board must be appointed by the attorney general from the
	attorney general's legal staff and shall serve a term of five years. One member of the
	board must be appointed by the insurance commissioner. One member of the board
	must be appointed by the tax commissioner. Each member appointed under this
	subsection must be receiving retirement benefits under or be an active participating
	member under this chapter, the retirement plan established under chapter 54-52.6, the
	retirement plan established under chapter 39-03.1, or the job service North Dakota
	retirement plan. A member appointed under this subsection shall serve a term of two
	years. A member appointed under this subsection serves at the pleasure of the
	appointing officer.
4.	The state health officer appointed under section 23-01-05 or the state health officer's
	designee is a member of the board.
<u>5.4.</u>	Three board members must be elected by and from among the active participating
	members, members of the retirement plan established under chapter 54-52.6,
	members of the retirement plan established under chapter 39-03.1, and members of
	the job service North Dakota retirement plan. Employees who have terminated their
	<u>3.4.</u>

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1		employment for whatever reason are not eligible to serve as elected members of the	
2		board under this subsection. Board members must be elected to a five-year term	
3		pursuant to an election called by the board. Notice of board elections must be given to	
4		all active participating members. The time spent in performing duties as a board	
5		member may not be charged against any employee's accumulated annual or any	
6		other type of leave.	
7	6.	One board member must be elected by and from among those individuals who are	
8		receiving retirement benefits under this chapter. The board shall call the election and	
9		must give prior notice of the election to the individuals eligible to participate in the	
10		election pursuant to this subsection. The board member shall serve a term of five-	
11		years.	
12	7.<u>5.</u>	The members of the board are entitled to receive one hundred forty-eight dollars per	
13		day compensation and necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in	
14		sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. This is in addition to any other pay or allowance due	
15		the chairman or a member, plus an allowance for expenses they may incur through	
16		service on the board.	
17	8.<u>6.</u>	A board member shall serve a five-year term and until the board member's successor	
18		qualifies. Each board member is entitled to one vote, and five<u>six</u>eight of the	
19		nine <u>eleven</u> board members constitute a quorum. Five<u>Six</u> votes are necessary for	
20		resolution or action by the board at any meeting.	
21	7.	A legislator member does not have a conflict of interest in a matter before the board	
22		based solely on that member's status of being a legislator.	
23	8.	A person may not bring a civil action against the board unless that person has a	
24		unique and significant injury.	
25	SECTION 2. PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM - MAIN SYSTEM DEFINED		
26	BENEFIT PLAN INVESTMENTS. During the 2023-25 biennium, the retirement board may not		
27	reduce the actuarial rate of return assumption for the public employees retirement system main		
28	system defined benefit plan below six and one-half percent.		
29	9 SECTION 3. PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM - RETIREMENT PLAN		
30	TRANSITION EDUCATION. During the 2023-25 biennium, the public employees retirement		
31	system shall conduct an informational campaign to educate current and prospective state		

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- 1 employees of the transition from the defined benefit retirement plan to the defined contribution
- 2 retirement plan.

3 SECTION 4. PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM BOARD - TRANSITION.

4 Upon the effective date of this Act, the terms of all members of the public employees retirement

- 5 system board end, and within fourteen days following the effective date of this Act, all appointing
- 6 officers shall appoint individuals to serve on the board.

7 SECTION 5. EXEMPTION - EMPLOYEE BENEFITS PROGRAMS COMMITTEE. This Act

- 8 is exempt from the requirements of section 54-35-02.4.
- 9 SECTION 6. RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act apply
- 10 retroactively to July 1, 2023.
- 11 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective immediately upon its filing with
- 12 the secretary of state.
