



Good morning, Mr. Chairman Klemin, vice chair Karls and Judiciary committee,
Vicky Steiner, District 37, Dickinson.

This bill ensures some of the women from the majority party in the house have a future opportunity for chairmanships and legislative management.

The veteran legislators are likely aware of this but for those who are new to this process or to listening, I'll briefly cover how it works.

Legislators send in a preference for their choices of committees. The majority leader ultimately picks the chairman of the regular session legislative committees and legislative management is a position from all the republicans for those seats.

We have something called Committee on committees that meets to put legislators on the various committees. There's Appropriations which meets every day. There are A committees that meet Monday–Wednesday. Education, Finance and Taxation, Human Services, Industry, Business and this committee Judiciary. Then there are B committees that meet Thursday and Friday. Transportation, Agriculture, Energy and Natural Resources, Government and Veterans Affairs, Political Subdiv

Over the past 20 years, there was one session, 2011, when there were 2 women chairs according to research from the library in Legislative council.

The two chairs were the late Rae Ann Kelsch of Education and Bette Grande of GVA.

If you look at Exhibit #1, beginning in 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021 and 2023 have no women chairs though there are senior Republican women with more experience than junior men legislators who have advanced into these chair spots.

Our current GVA committee has a male chairman who's first session on GVA was 2019. He has served as vice chair of GVA. Serving on this session's GVA committee are two women who were elected in 2010, the women have eight years more experience and both served as vice chair of GVA. Both were passed over.

Ultimately it was the leader's decision who moves to the various committees. This leader we know is exactly like the other two leaders I've served under. They pick their own team, their own mix of men who are their friends. They might golf together, they eat out together, they trust each other.

The current GVA chair is a friend of the leader and actively helped him campaign for leader.

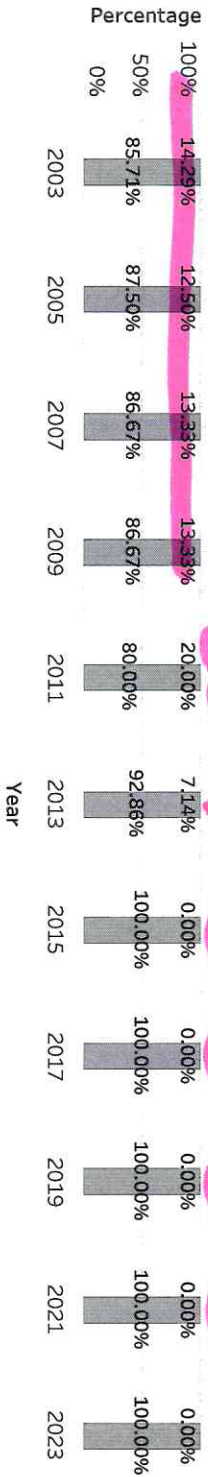

North Dakota Legislative Assembly Chairmen and Vice Chairmen by Gender: 2003-2023

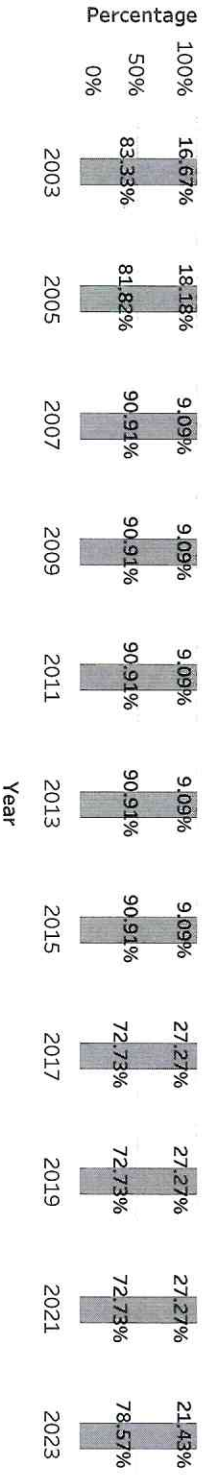

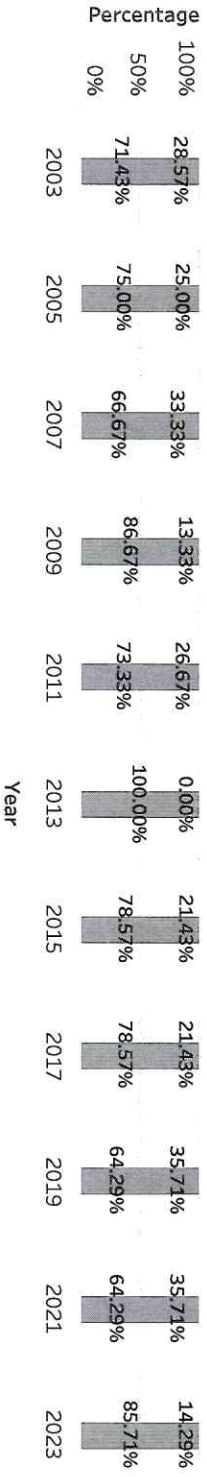
House Chairmen



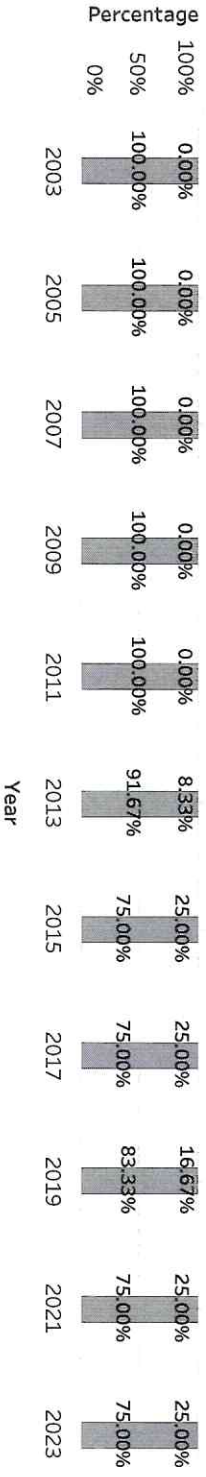
Senate Chairmen

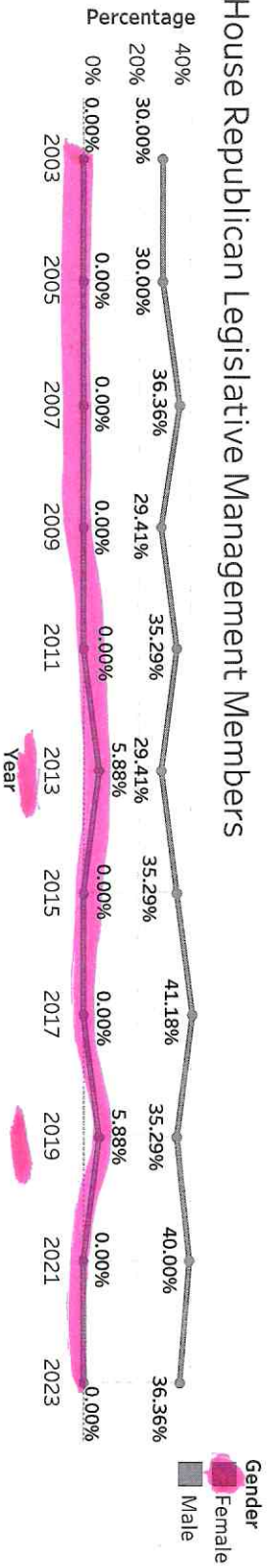

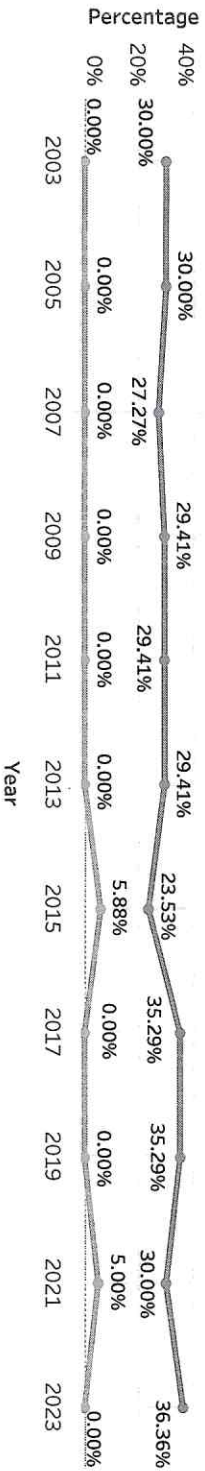
Legislative Management Membership by Political Party, Chamber, and Gender: 2003-2023

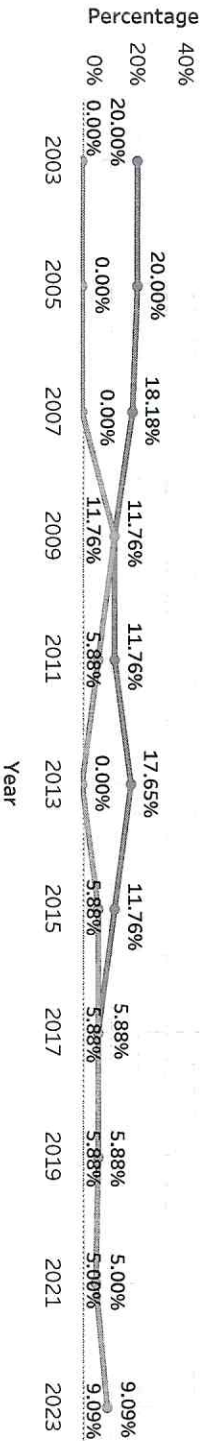
House Republican Legislative Management Members



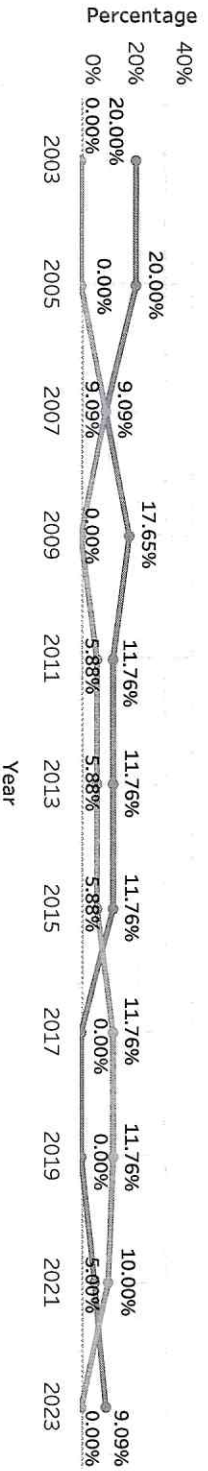
Senate Republican Legislative Management Members
