### **INFLATION IMPACTING**

- Day-to-day operational costs
- Increased cost to deliver
   workforce academic programs
- Student affordability
   Average BSC student is age 25+
- Staffing and talent retention
- Increasing construction costs –
   \$10M shortage (see addendum)



### **FUNDING FORMULA**

Despite being 5<sup>th</sup> in state appropriations in the NDUS

### **BSC IS**

- 3<sup>rd</sup> highest NDUS enrollment
- 1st in NDUS enrollment growth
  - Up 13% over last year
- 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest tuition in the NDUS



### **FUNDING FORMULA**

In the CTE division, BSC had a 26% spending increase.

2018-2019 Spending = \$8.6M 2020-2021 Spending = \$10.8M **\$2.2M Increase** 

An increase to a weight of 5 in the CTE funding formula would allow for growth in those programs.





### PROPOSED TUITION FREEZE

- Impacts 2023-25 operations
- Reduces the college's ability to respond to increased operational costs
- Restricts new workforce
   programming as the
   polytechnic mission focuses on
   high-cost programs for high priority occupations
- BSC's current tuition is 3<sup>rd</sup>
   lowest in the NDUS at \$174/credit

# #NDpoly ONE-TIME FUNDING >>> REQUEST #1 a's Polytechnic Institution

### **POLYTECHNIC FACILITY COST INFLATION**

Inflationary impact on construction costs for polytechnic facility - \$10M

#### **EXAMPLES:**

- Metals = 52% increase
- Roof = 57% increase
- HVAC = 46% increase

Overall inflationary increase = 29%

- Expands academic programming
- Brings us into compliance with Title IX and ADA
- Addresses current facility deficiencies

### Title IX Compliance

Title IX is a federal civil rights law prohibiting sexbased discrimination at any educational institution receiving federal funding.

Current facility (BSC Armory) has compliance risks



### **Title IX Compliance Risks**

Provision of Locker Rooms, Practice & Competitive Facilities 34 C.F.R. §106.41(c)(7):

- (1) the quality and availability of the facilities provided for practice and competitive events;
- (2) the exclusivity of use of facilities provided for practice and competitive events;
- (3) the availability of locker rooms;
- (4) the quality of locker rooms;
- (5) the maintenance of practice and competitive facilities; and
- (6) the preparation of facilities for practice and competitive events.



### **Title IX Compliance Risks**

Federal compliance seeks parity among educational facilities, including athletic facilities.

Quality involves equitable lockers, seating, lighting, flooring, maneuvering space, numbers of toilets, showers, and sinks.

### Title IX Compliance Risk Examples

Female locker rooms do not have plumbing

Female athletes cannot shower and have to use public restroom during games/practices whereas male student-athletes have access to private facilities



### Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Violations

Non-compliant spaces: restrooms, classrooms, instructional lab space, hallways, offices, media studio, concessions

Gymnasium seating does not accommodate individuals with special needs – must sit within one foot of the court



### **ADDITIONAL CURRENT FACILITY DEFICIENCIES**

- #1 Not equipped with a fire suppression system
- **#2** No external air exchange to building interior
- #3 2 of 4 air handling systems not operational
- #4 Portion of building already removed due to soil conditions and early construction techniques
- **#5** Presence of asbestos
- **#6** No central air conditioning
- **#7** Doors/walls too close to competition floor

- Mitigates compliance risk
- Provides a Title IX compliant multi-purpose academic facility
- Expands workforce development for the fields of ambulatory patient care, exercise science, clinical exercise therapy, physical mobility, etc.
- Expands academic programming to support regional and rural areas in ND





### **Business & Industry Focused**

- Includes the potential addition of an industry-supported health and wellness clinic
- Expands healthcare services with the potential addition of a clinic to facilitate hands-on student learning
- BSC has raised the match donation



To address the compliance and risk issues and expand polytechnic academic programming, BSC requests \$29.9M in funding for this multi-purpose facility.
