- 1 Four year capital project plan: 07/01/2023 - 06/30/2027
- 2 NDUS could not request any capital construction projects for the 4 year period.
- 3 NDUS could approve projects that are 100% funded through local or other special funds during the 4 year period including Residence Halls, etc.
- 4 Universities/colleges are required to have the local pledge/other funds secured before any General Funds can be disbursed for the projects.
- 5 Universities/colleges will have four years to obtain local/special funds.
- 6 Any inflationary or other costs that exceed the project total would have to be paid through local/special funds and the obligation of the state would remain as listed.
- 7 The cost of the project can be less than the project total as listed above. However, the local match percentage requirement will still remain the same and correlate to the project total.
- 8 Other funds can be used for the planning process of a project. However, the amount spent for the planning and etc. can not be counted toward the local match.
- 9 Any additional funds over the local match authorization can be used for the project.
- 10 The Capital projects for the total four years would be appropriated during the 2023-2025 biennium.
- 11 Budget section approval prior to disbursement of general funds.
- 12 Funding source would be through the SIFF (Strategic Investment and Improvement Fund).
