Sections 15 and 16 would provide for the continuation of the capital building fund program, including a transfer of \$19 million from SIIF to the University System capital building fund and the authorization to use money in the fund for new capital projects.

Capital projects requests - Restriction

Section 10 provides for a transfer of \$1.5 million from Bank of North Dakota profits to the University System office for dual-credit tuition scholarships.

Commission and Budget Section approval.

Sections 11 and 12 provide for transfers totaling \$15 million from Bank profits to the career builders program. Sections 23 through 25 amend language to continue and expand the program.

Sections 13 and 14 provide for the continuation of the capital building fund program, including a transfer of \$29 million from SIIF to the University System capital building fund and the authorization to use money in the fund for new capital projects. Section 34 restricts the use of capital building fund money for deferred maintenance and extraordinary repairs projects to academic and student housing facilities.

Section 15 restricts the State Board of Higher Education from requesting state funds for capital projects from the 69th Legislative Assembly.
