Section 4 appropriates $\$ 49,970,100$ from SIIF for the renovation of Old Main at MaSU.
Section 5 requires institutions to match state extraordinary repairs funding on a $\$ 1$ to $\$ 1$ basis using operations or other funding, except for UND and NDSU, which must match $\$ 2$ to $\$ 1$.
Section 6 identifies $\$ 293,290,000$ for various institution capital projects is from SIIF.

Section 7 identifies $\$ 4.8$ million appropriated from the general fund NDSU is for creating or expanding programs and enrollment initiatives to address workforce needs.

Section 17 authorizes the transfer of funds between UND and the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences based on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Higher Education.
Section 18 provides for the Chancellor of the University System to provide an annual report to the Budget Section regarding higher education trends.

Section 20 requires the State Board of Higher Education to approve institution requests for new academic programs within 30 days.

Section 38 also eliminates the definition of "projects dedicated exclusively to the advancement of academics" to allow the matching grants to be used as the donor and institution choose

Section 30 requires institutions to identify matching funds for future capital project requests for state funds.

Section 31 provides for all CTE credits to receive a weighting factor of 5 in the higher education funding formula. Section 33 restores the 96 percent minimum amount payable provision in the higher education funding formula.
