NDCA is established in NDCC chapter 54-54. Its statutory responsibilities, as well as current mission statement are addressed in Narrative (Testimony) document.

**2. Explain the purpose of the agency’s various divisions/programs – Attach organizational chart.**

This information is addressed in Narrative (Testimony) document and attached.

**3. Report any audit findings included in the most recent audit of your department or institution and action taken to address each finding.**

NDCA’s most recent audit (FY19-21 biennium) contained one finding – “Payroll Charged to Federal Award Not Supported.” The majority of NDCA salary costs have been paid with general funds. COVID-related federal funding (CARES & ARP) *included* salary administration allocations to handle increased workload related to COVID-relief grants. NDCA handled these as temporary workload adjustments and documented these adjustments based on increased tasks assigned per employee for applicable time periods. Specific time spent on COVID work was not recorded separately. To address this finding, NDCA worked with OMB to expand its Time and Labor reporting in Peoplesoft to track staff time to be charged to federal programs in the future.

7. Discuss the purpose and use of any one-time funding items for the current biennium.

Addressed in Narrative (Testimony) document.

8. Identify and justify the need for any one-time funding included or being requested.

The budget recommended for NDCA in 23-25 contains five one-time items, all funded with general funds:

- **Leave Payout for Retiring Staff (\$106,430)** Three key positions are known to be vacated in the coming biennium due to retirement: Arts Education Director, Executive Director and Fiscal Officer.
- **Strategic Planning Consultant (\$40,000)** A current strategic plan is a required to be eligible to receive funding from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). During its most recent process in 2020, NDCA moved from a 3-yr plan to a 5-yr plan. The next strategic planning process will begin in 2024 specifically for services for the 23-25 biennium.
- **Technology Needs (\$10,000)** NDCA is looking to further enhance aspects of its operation through use of technology. This includes: a video projector and screen to be installed in NDCA's downtown office to allow classes, workshops, and meetings to be available and offered in a professional manner, increased organizational service contracts (rather than individual accounts).
- **Office Equipment & Furniture Under \$5,000 (\$2,500)** Workspace setup for new FTE requested.
- **Arts Across the Prairie (\$100,000)** NDCA's Arts Across the Prairie (AAP) Initiative envisions eight large scale public art pieces to be designed, created, and installed in ND, one in each of the state's regions. This request will cover funds for fees and permits, and ND artist stipends.

**9. Discuss agency collections that are deposited in the general fund or a special fund, and any anticipated changes from 2021 legislative estimates during the 2021-23 biennium and estimated changes for the 2023-25 biennium.**

NDCA collects a small amount of revenue from the sale of existing merchandise and publications. The sales (less than \$1,000 per year) received are deposited into the agency's Earned Income (special) fund for future use should a new publication or reprint of a current volume be warranted.

**10. Discuss the need for any other sections that are included or are requested/recommended to be included in the agency appropriation bill**

In addition to Section 1, which specifies the agency's Appropriation, four additional sections are included in NDCA's budget bill, HB 1010:

*Section 2 – One-Time Funding – Effect on Base Budget-Report to the Sixty-Ninth Legislative Assembly*

This section was added by the Legislature and will require NDCA to report on one-time items during the next biennial budget process. We can and will comply with this.

*Section 3 – Appropriation – Cultural Endowment Fund*

NDCC Sections 54-54-08.1 and 54-54-08.2 establish the ND Cultural Endowment Fund and authorize expenditures of interest earnings from the fund by NDCA. Section 3 of HB 1010 provides continuing appropriation authority for the ND Cultural Endowment Fund. NDCA's board may, at its discretion, approve additional items to be funded, beyond two annual Individual Artist Fellowships, therefore continuing appropriation authority is a necessary part of NDCA's appropriations bill.

*Section 4 – Appropriation – Gift, Grants, and Bequests*

Provides that all gift, grants, devises, bequests, donations, and assignments received by NDCA are appropriated to the Council for use. This item will relieve NDCA from having to seek Emergency Commission approval for special funds received.

*Section 5 – Exemption – Line of Transfers – Report*

This section permits NDCA to request transfers of funds between lines items, which will allow for increased flexibility in administering the agency's budget. This section also specifies that NDCA report to Legislative Council any such transfers after FY24 and to the Legislative Assembly as part of our 25-27 budget request in two years.

**11. Discuss any other bills being considered by the Legislative Assembly and their potential budgetary impact on the agency.**

In addition to House Bill 1010, two bills will be presented by Senators Mathern and Krebsbach related to the Poet Laureate position, as the currently named individual has passed on. The biennial funding (\$10,000) will not change but the framework and responsibilities, as well as the naming of the Poet Laureate position, are suggested to be shifted to a set term – not in perpetuity.

There may be a request for an additional \$1 million for its *Arts Across the Prairie* maintenance fund, to be placed with the current endowment allocation held in RIO. This will increase the life-span coverage of interest accrued to be utilized across the State of North Dakota for over 50 years.

N/A – NDCA did not receive any recovery funding through the November 2021 special legislative session.

While considering NDCA's FTE request, House Appropriations made a change that would negatively impact NDCA's staffing resources –funding was removed for the agency's temporary position. In addition, three items have come to light since NDCA's House appropriations hearings and budget actions, and, therefore, were not considered by the House.

NDCA asks for Senate consideration and support of these four items:

---

**1) Restoration of Funding for Temporary Employee (\$122,446)**

NDCA requested two new full-time positions (an Administrative Assistant and a Program Manager) in its 23-25 Biennium Budget to join the current staff of five FTEs and one Full-Time Temporary Employee. The Governor's Executive Recommendation included one of the two requested positions, the Administrative Assistant III. House Appropriations and the full House floor also approved the Administrative Assistant FTE.

However, House Appropriations also *REMOVED* funding for NDCA's Full-Time Temporary Employee, thereby allowing no growth in staff for the agency. This was a position hard fought for in the last biennium. As NDCA is amid a new statewide program (*Arts Across the Prairie*), has gained additional program/operating workload (DEI initiatives, Poet Laureate processes, a new CRM software program, ND Corrections Partnership Project), and been historically understaffed, losing a position is not a viable option. [NDCA asks the Senate to restore funding for its Full-Time Temporary Employee \(\\$122,446\)](#) so we can realize actual growth in staffing resources.

---

**2) Addition of Emergency Clause to Leave Payout Requested**

NDCA's 23-25 budget request includes the following one-time item, which was approved by the House:

**Leave Payout for Retiring Staff (\$106,430):** Three key positions were anticipated to be vacated in the coming biennium, due to retirement eligibility: Arts Education Director, Executive Director, and Fiscal Officer. In addition, NDCA's Folklorist is already eligible to retire.

NDCA's Arts Education Director just announced plans to retire *this* April, so this funding is needed sooner than the start of the new biennium. [NDCA asks the Senate to add an Emergency Clause to its Leave Payout one-time item](#) to allow NDCA to use what's needed in the current biennium and carry the balance over to the new biennium for use there.

---

### **3) Addition of Special Fund / Grants Line Spending Authority**

NDCA's 23-25 budget request includes \$10,000 of special fund spending authority for purchases related to its written and audio publications, which was approved by the House.

During the current biennium, NDCA received Emergency Commission approval to accept an \$80,000 Momentum Fund grant from ND Department of Commerce to sub-grant across the state as part of the *Arts Across the Prairie (AAP)* initiative. To-date, NDCA has sub-granted only one \$10,000 grant, leaving \$70,000 still to be awarded as progress with AAP partners continues. [NDCA asks the Senate to increase its Special Fund Spending Authority and its Grants Line \(each by \\$70,000\)](#) to allow NDCA to continue our sub-granting of these funds into the new biennium.

---

### **4) Correction to Administrative Assistant III Salary Requested**

NDCA's 23-25 budget request includes the addition of one FTE and \$134,492 of salaries line funding for an Administrative Assistant III, which was approved by the House. This request provides a monthly salary of \$3,267 for the new position.

However, this calculation this did not account for movement in the salary ranges during the current biennium and the new biennium, causing our proposed salary to be below the current minimum monthly for the position of \$3,374, an amount that will increase to \$3,649 by FY25 due to the proposed 4/4%.

[NDCA asks the Senate to increase its Salaries Line by \\$10,508](#), which will bring biennial funding for the new FTE to \$145,00 and ensure the position is paid a salary within the approved range throughout the new biennium.

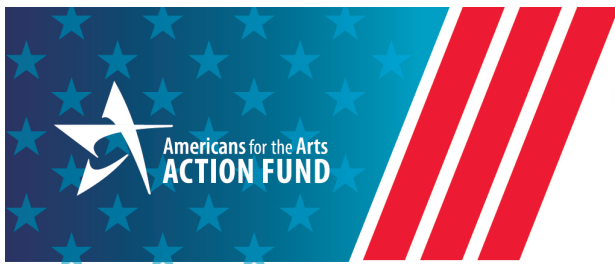

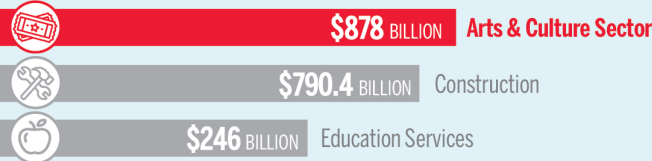

### ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 4.5% OF NATION'S GDP & 5.1 MILLION JOBS

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that nationally the arts and culture sector is a **\$878 billion industry**, representing 4.5% of the nation's GDP—a larger share of the economy than construction or education services.

## NORTH DAKOTA ARTS FACTS

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that the arts and culture sector contributes \$1.45 billion to North Dakota's economy representing 2.8% of the state's GDP—a larger share than some other industries in the state.

Audiences of 783,606 people added another **\$19.1 million** in related spending for a total of **\$41.2 million** for the region in 2015, and this generated **\$3.5 b** in local and state government revenues.

**Q** So how much is the federal government investing in the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)?

**A** Congress has proposed allocating **\$162.25 million** to the NEA in FY 2020, which has been relatively level for the last several years. This amounts to just **49¢** per capita, yet the nonprofit arts industry generates over \$13 billion in federal tax revenue back to the treasury. Imagine what nonprofit arts groups could generate with \$1 per capita!

**Q** What about North Dakota—how much does state government budget to the North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) each year?

**A** In FY 2020, the state allocated **\$809,342** to NDCA. The Council also received **\$731,200** in federal NEA funds, which they re-granted funds to dozens of cultural organizations throughout the state. Another 3 nonprofit arts organizations received direct grants from the NEA totaling \$130,000.

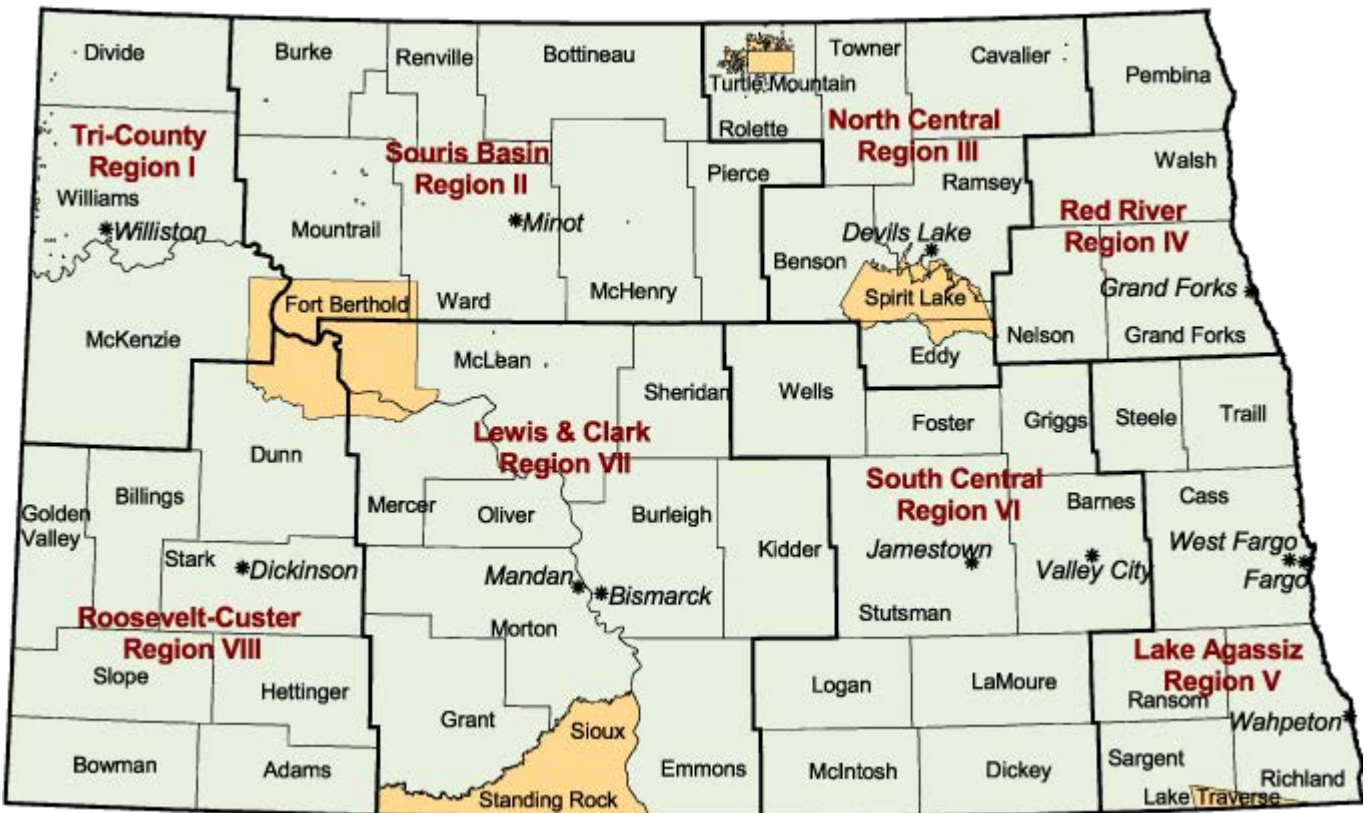
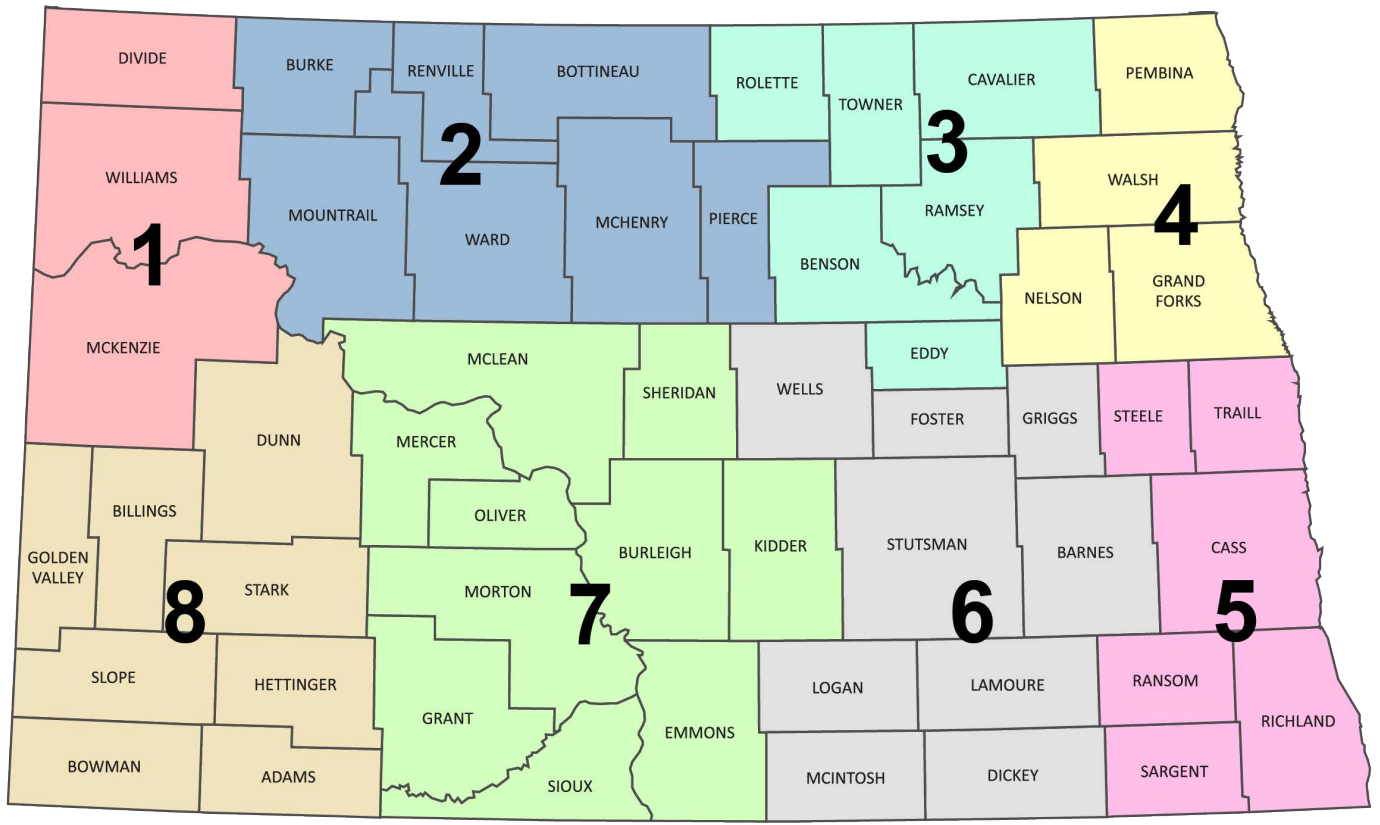
