

Recommendations

Commerce Initial Proposal \$444,000

- DOLLAR FOR DOLLAR Federal match for the ND AHEC Program
- Increase ND AHEC staffing by 1 FTE for implementing health care workforce education in grades 7-12 in rural ND schools
- Consolidation of workforce development resources
- Continue expansion of HOSA chapters & membership in rural ND schools
- Enhance evaluation to include tracking participants

Governor's Proposal \$250,000

- Maintaining program at current state
- Continue health career awareness
- Seek out grants where available

Return on Investment

- State funds double the investment from the federal government
- 1:1 Federal match required
- Retention of health care professionals in critical and underserved rural areas

Area Health Education Center Program - Funding Restrictions

- Not less than 75% of the total federal funding shall be allocated to the regional Area Health Education Centers.
- Not more than 25% of the total federal funding shall be allocated to the AHEC Program Office.
- Indirect costs are limited to 8%, as a result of being categorized as a training grant.
- Match requirement is 1:1 (federal funds to non-federal contributions).
- 25% of non-federal match contributions shall be in cash.
